Bloomfield Teen Killed In Accident

BLOOMFIELD, Neb. — A Bloomfield teenager has died and another Bloomfield teen has been injured in a weekend accident, according to the Knox County Sheriff's Office.

The accident occurred Saturday on 879th Avenue in Knox County, Neb., located 2 miles south and 3/4 mile east of Bloomfield.

Jessica McDonald, 17, was driving a 2000 Dodge with a passenger, 17-year-old Dustin Poppe, when she went off the road and rolled into a field.

McDonald was fatally injured, and Poppe was injured and flown to Mercy Hospital in Sioux City, Iowa. The vehicle was totaled.

Bloomfield Fire and Rescue, as well as LifeNet, responded to the accident.

The Knox County Sheriff's Office investigated the accident, assisted by the Bloomfield Police Department.

Wagner Awarded \$309,000 For Expansion

WAGNER — The city of Wagner has been awarded a \$309,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for an expansion project at Wagner Community Memorial Hospital, Gov. Mike Rounds announced Monday.

"Enlarging and improving the hospital will provide enhanced health care to the residents of Wagner and surrounding areas," the governor said. "Providing first-class health care is vital to the excellent quality of life enjoyed by South Dakotans."

The project, which is in its second phase, will add about 10,000 square feet and 17 patient beds to the hospital. The hospice room, emergency triage area, telemedicine area, nurses' station, pharmacy and family waiting area will all be renovated. The building's heating, cooling, plumbing and electrical systems will also be upgraded.

The first phase of the project was completed last year and included expanding the clinic and physical therapy areas.

CDBG is a reimbursement program, and the community will receive the funds as work is completed.

The CDBG program provides communities with financial resources to address a wide range of unique community development needs. Past grants have been used for improvements and construction of community buildings, fire halls, water systems and sewer systems.

The federal Department of Housing and Urban Development funds the CDBG program, and the Governor's Office of Economic Development administers it.

In addition to leading what is bound to be a lively deconstruction and cultural critique of Captain William Clark's journal entry on Spirit Mound, Gannon will identify bird species most likely to be encountered at the site. We will then drive to Spirit Mound, observe and write. If time allows, we will share our writings.

Bring writing materials and wear walking shoes; you may also want to bring binoculars and bug spray. Attendees will travel in their own vehicles (ridesharing encouraged) to Spirit Mound.
