Miami's Miller Says He'll Be Fine For Game 2 Of NBA Finals

MIAMI (AP)—Miami Heat reserve guard Mike Miller is back at practice, less than 24 hours after leaving the arena with his left arm in a sling. Miller said Wednesday he'll be ready for Game 2 of the NBA finals Thursday against the Dallas Mavericks. He wore a sleeve on his arm during Game 1 and graced several times

while managing six points and five rebounds in 20 minutes. Miller missed much of the season with a series of injuries, but was part of a superior bench effort in the 92-84 win over Dallas. The Heat reserves outscored the Mavericks' reserves 27-17 and rebounded them 15-8.

USD Athletics Assists In Flood Preparation Efforts

VERMILION — More than two dozen student-athletes and coaches from the University of South Dakota athletic department assisted with the ongoing flood preparation efforts in the Dakota Dunes and Yankton areas as the two communities prepare for an increase in the flow of water downstream on the Missouri River.

According to a press release Wednesday, the volunteers helped in the ongoing sandbagging efforts Tuesday as the threat of flooding looms in both Dakota Dunes and Yankton. It is part of a larger effort from USD as a whole. The university has sent volunteers in shifts to the two areas. The university is housing more than 250 National Guard troops who are assisting in the efforts. In addition to helping with sandbagging efforts in Dakota Dunes and Yankton, the volunteers are also helping to serve food for the guard troops.

There also has been a volunteer effort in Vermillion, as sandbaggers are being requested there as well. More than 200 volunteers have assisted in various ways in the flood preparation efforts.

White said he hopes to have Lesnar back in action around the beginning of 2012.

Augustana, Minnesota State Game To Be Televised Nationally

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. — NCAA Division II and CBS Sports Network announced Tuesday that Augustana's 2011 football game at Minnesota State will be televised live on CBS Sports Network. As a result of the telecast, the contest has been moved to Oct. 27 at 7 p.m. The game is one of six Division II tilts for the 2011 season the NCAA and CBS College Sports have agreed to broadcast. CBS Sports Network is available to more than 95 million U.S. households through a variety of cable and satellite providers. The game will also be simulcast at ncaa.com and available for syndication on local and regional networks. This marks the first time in school history a sporting event involving Augustana will be nationally televised. Augustana topped MSU 17-13 a year ago when the two schools met

in Sioux Falls. Last season, Augustana recorded a school-record 11 wins (three more than the previous record), captured a share of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference South Division title and made their first playoff appearance since 1989.

Man Peads Guilty In SD Baseball Camp Scam

RAPID CITY (AP) — A man accused of promoting a bogus baseball camp in South Dakota has pleaded guilty to grand theft by embezzlement. KEVIN-TV reports that 35-year-old Jason Anderson faces up to 20 years in prison and up to \$40,000 in fines when he is sentenced on June 27.

Authorities say Anderson collected more than \$20,000 from Rapid City parents last year for a baseball camp that never happened. He says he spent the money on drugs and gambling.

Dickinson State Wins DAC Commissioner's Cup

DICKINSON, N.D. (AP) — Dickinson State University has won the Dakota Athletic Conference Commissioner's Cup for the third straight year and the fifth time in the last six years. The award goes to the DAC school with the best record in conference competition. Points are given based on each school's finish in the standings in various conference sports. DSU won or shared five conference titles during the year, in football, softball, volleyball and both indoor and outdoor men's track and field. Black Hills State captured six conference championships but finished second in total points, with 75 to DSU's 79. Jamestown College was third, followed by Minot State, South Dakota Mines, Valley City State, Dakota State and Mayville State.
