tion and honored Miller for his teachings in a unique way.

"Soldiers can fly a special flag while they're deployed," he said. "It's just something that soldiers are allowed to do for people who supported them while they were deployed, for people who were a positive influence on them and on some level, instilled a sense of civil service."

Winter said he wanted to fly the flag in honor of Miller as a "thank you" for being one of his favorite teachers.

"I liked him as a teacher, he made history relevant to me. He made me enjoy school and was one of the few teachers who did. I just wanted to recognize him."

After being back from deployment for over a year, Winter said he had almost forgot about the flag. While he was moving to a new house, he found the flag and told his parents about it. They suggested he present it to Miller at the annual Yankton Middle School end-of-the-year awards ceremony.

"I presented it during the awards ceremony. I hadn't planned on making a big production out of it, but I heard he may be retiring," Winter said. "I just said 'I really didn't care a whole

lot about school when I was in middle school at that age, I'm not sure how many kids do, but I really enjoyed your class and paid attention, and this is proof."

Miller said he never expected a student to recall information like that after so long. He felt very special for what Winter did for him.

"I was surprised that he remembered that. It made me feel good knowing that he remembered all that stuff," Miller said. "I had never been honored like that. I felt pretty proud of myself and good about him knowing that it was that important to him to do that for me."

Realizing that some students are taking in more than it ap-

pears made Miller recognize that he does have an impact on their lives.

"It makes me feel really good that even though some of them aren't always paying attention, they're learning the history of their country," he said.

Winter said he really enjoyed honoring Miller in a way he never expected.

"It was a nice thing (to honor him)," Winter said. "It means to me that I can do something nice for a teacher who had a pretty profound effect on me because I really didn't give a crap about history, I never really had any attitude for it and never found it that interesting, but he made it interesting."

As for the flag, Miller said it is displayed in a glass case and he plans to hang it in his house where he will always remember what he accomplished as a teacher.

With so many teacher cuts happening in Yankton, Winter said he was glad he had an opportunity to honor a teacher, which doesn't happen very often.

"Too often good teachers go unrecognized and I didn't know what was happening with the teachers in Yankton," he said. "I don't make it back to Yankton very often, but it seemed to mean quite a bit to (Miller). I know he wasn't expecting it."
