“Yankton is unique with its volunteering and with its effort to help,” Rhoades said. “We have had people from five different states offer to help. People in and out of the community have helped.”

Although there is some debate as to which areas will be the most severely affected by the rising river, Jensen said if there are any doubts, people in the Riverside Acres area should move everything out of their basements and install sump pumps to aid in controlling the water.

Rhoades said there are volunteers available to help sandbag and move possessions from homes.

Corps engineer David Becker, project manager for Gavin's Point Dam, was also on hand Friday to help explain what caused this sudden problem with the river.

The primary cause of the need to release water from dams along the Missouri River is due to the abnormal amount of rain that Wyoming, Montana and the western Dakotas have received this spring, Becker said. Rainfall was 300 to 600 times more than normal and, along with the melting snow in the mountains, caused the backup reservoirs to fill to capacity unexpectedly.

Becker said water is being released aggressively now because if they were to wait any longer, even higher flows would be needed. The Corps is planning on normal rainfall within the next few months but if it were to increase, the release from the spillways would rise. Releases will be increased to 100,000 cubic feet per second today (Saturday) and hit a peak release of 150,000 cfs starting June 14. Those releases are expected to continue until at least August.

“There was little time to react after the May rains,” Becker said. “High-water years bring pain and suffering to everyone. We're devoting everything we have to protect people and reduce damages.”

Because evacuation of Larson's Landing and Riverside Acres are only voluntary as of right now, utility companies are only disconnecting services and removing equipment when called by customers. If it were to change to mandatory evacuation, all energy supplies would be shut off and removed without customers' calls. While

most companies say there are no disconnecting fees and will not charge to reconnect later. Officials at Bon Homme-Yankton Electric said it is hoping to cut its normal \$52 fee to reconnect in half, if not completely remove it.

As the dam releases continue to increase over the next few days, Rettig said those days would determine which areas would get water. There is worry by most people in the expected affected areas that water will backup in their basements even if the floodwaters don't reach their houses.

Water has yet to reach any houses. Becker said the reason for that is because, since the Gavins Point Dam was built in the 1950s, the river has deepened by almost 20 feet. Water is always carrying sediment, Becker said, but most of it gets caught in the dam. After the water passes through, it scours the bottom looking for sediment to carry, causing the river to deepen and widen.

Afterwards, Rettig said he thought the meeting served its purpose to answer concerns.

“There's been a lot of questions since this thing started last Saturday about what's the best information, what's the most accurate information so we've taken an aim to try to put together the best information,” he said. “People started walking out early and generally, to me, that's a good thing because they don't wait around until the end to ask questions or chew you. To that effect, I think it was good because people got the answers that they were looking for.”

Pam Grimme lives five blocks away from the river and said, although she isn't in the mapped affected area, she wanted to learn as much as she could to plan ahead.

“We just wanted to hear what they had to say, if the river was going to come up higher, if they said anything about ground seepage and how to handle that,” Grimme said. “With the questions they got, I think they did a good job of answering them.”

Trinity Lutheran Church is serving as the home base for collecting food donations to help keep people stocked with necessities. If interested in volunteering, people should contact Rhoades.

**Court Lifts Ban On Graduation Prayer**

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Public prayer will be allowed at a Texas high school graduation after a federal appeals court on Friday reversed a ban won by an agnostic family that claimed ceremony traditions such as invocations are unconstitutional.

The 5th Circuit Court of Appeals granted the emergency appeal filed by the Medina Valley Independent School District.

The San Antonio-area school was ordered by a federal judge earlier this week to forbid students from asking audience members to join in prayer or bow their heads at Saturday's graduation.

The lawsuit was filed on behalf of Christa and Danny Schultz, whose son is graduating.

The family's suit was being backed by the Washington-based Americans United for Separation of Church and State.

Joe Conn, a spokesman for the organization, declined immediate comment.

The school district's appeal was supported by Texas Gov. Rick Perry, the state's attorney general and conservative groups.

“We're thrilled that the court upheld the rights of students to be able to say prayers and other religious statements in their own capacity,” said Hiram Sasser, director of litigation for the conservative Liberty Institute, which filed a motion in support of the school district's appeal.

The Schultzes claimed traditions at graduation, including the invocation and benediction, excluded their beliefs.

U.S. District Judge Fred Biery's original ruling prohibited students from praying at the graduation.

Biery instead suggested that students modify their remarks to be “statements of their own beliefs,” allow them to make the sign of the cross, wear a yarmulke or hijab, or kneel to face Mecca.
