Wheat for July delivery fell 29.75 cents to \$7.44 a bushel; July corn slid 22 cents to \$7.32 a bushel; July oats fell 6 cents to \$3.72 a bushel; while July soybeans tumbled 31.25 cents to \$13.8325 a bushel.
