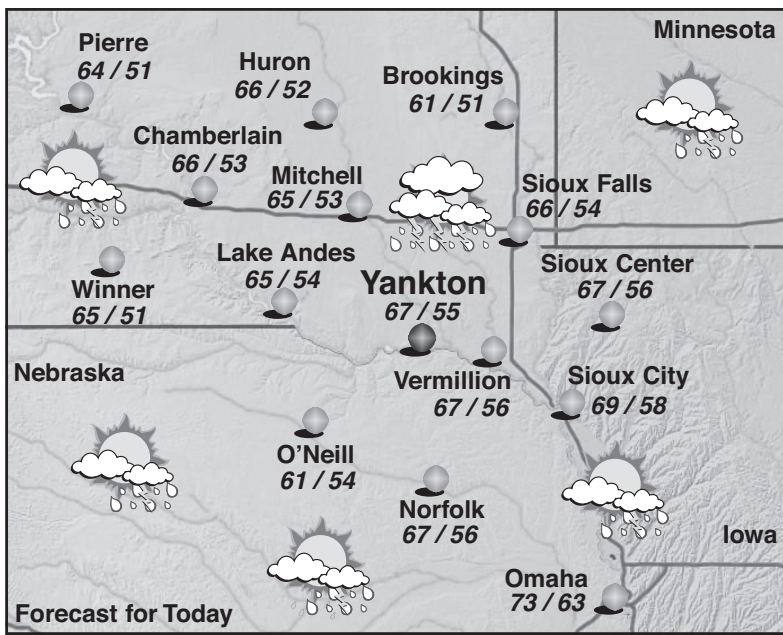

Memorial Day Decorations To Be Removed

All Memorial Day grave decorations must be removed at Yankton's Sacred Heart Cemetery by the evening of Sunday, June 12. This includes all wrought-iron and miscellaneous small items as they interfere with trimming and mowing. All remaining items will be picked up on Monday morning, June 13, by cemetery staff and discarded. The Yankton Municipal Cemetery announced that all Memorial Day flowers, including artificial and those not in permanent planters must be removed by Monday, June 13, after which they may be removed by the cemetery staff. All articles removed by the cemetery will not be accounted for after 10 days. In accordance with cemetery policy, fresh cut flowers may be used and will remain until they become wilted and unsightly.

"I think it's great to have the machine here in Yankton because we have a pretty good veteran base," Berke said. "We have the ability to accommodate them into our schedule where we're not banging patients in and out the door. We'll be able to accommodate these patients in a timely manner." Berke said although there are other 3T MRIs in the United States, not many are doing the work similar to what will be done in Yankton.

"There are other ones in the country — 3T MRIs have been around for a few years, but there's not that many of them that are doing the functional MRI scanning that we're doing," he said. "Most of those are occurring at the major universities, so this is pretty unique to this area." The Department of Defense gave USD grant money to purchase the computer system, but Avera had to purchase the actual MRI machine, Berke said. Taylor said despite the possibility of newer technology in the next few years, they will not have to replace the MRI machine to stay ahead of other hospitals. "There's two different aspects — one is the magnet, and the other is the computer that runs the magnet tells it to do different things. As the computers change, we won't change the strength of the magnet, but over time we'll be able to have it do different things than it does now," he said. "Any MRI has that capability to a certain point. This is Siemens top of the line and any additional changes that they do will be available to us." Berke said they hope to have the machine running by June 27. While hospital personnel is still experimenting with how they can use the machine, he thinks MRIs will begin to have more of a clinical impact, as more patients are able to use the machine.
