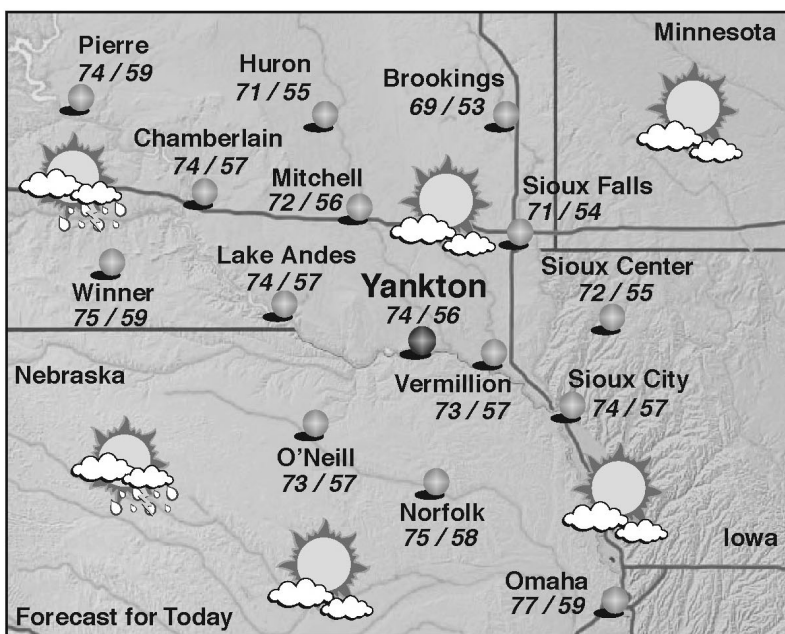

City Commission To Consider Paving Alley Near Meridian Bridge Plaza

 The Yankton City Commission will consider paving the alley just west of Walnut Street between Second Street and Riverside Drive Monday.
 Walnut south of Second Street will be closed to vehicular traffic when the Meridian Bridge is opened for recreational purposes later this year. The alley work will provide paved access for property owners along Walnut.
 In other business Monday, the

commission will consider the removal of some parking stalls along Third Street by the Riverfront Event Center, new lighting along 31st Street west of Broadway related to the Menards development and an agreement with Yankton County to provide fire protection and sanitary sewer to the new county highway shop.
 The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

 cer for Yankton County Office of Emergency Management, said that he is not aware of a significant issue with regards to non-Yankton County residents accessing the stockpile of sandbags made here.
 "As far as I am concerned, they are there for public use," he said. "We are not patrolling who is taking them for use or for where. But, they are designated for Yankton county residents."
 • Yankton County Office of Emergency Management (YCOEM) is sustaining the Emergency Operations Center through the weekend, but will return to regular office operations and hours as of Monday, June 13.

 Beginning Monday, anyone who needs assistance during regular business hours should contact the Emergency Management office at (605) 668-5289.
 The YCOEM is continuing to monitor releases at Gavins Point Dam and the impact the higher water is having on affected properties
 • State Labor and Regulation secretary Pam Roberts announces

the Division of Insurance has issued a bulletin requiring insurance coverage on property relocated in connection with the recent flooding in South Dakota. Additional details on who is affected can be found by viewing the bulletin <http://www.sdjobs.org/reg/insurance/bulletins.htm>.
 "We cannot have millions of dollars in personal property and business inventory sitting without adequate insurance coverage," said Roberts in a press release.
 Under the terms of the bulletin, those policies that either do not cover or have reduced coverage for property removed from its primary premises must cover the property at the alternative locations until July 8.
 "This gives property owners time to work with their agents and companies to provide more permanent insurance coverage for their personal property," added Division of Insurance Director Merle Scheiber.
 Consumers should contact their agents or insurance companies before July 8 to understand and update their coverage. The bulletin also relaxes the regulatory approval process for insurance companies who are providing additional coverage for relocated property.
