## Man Pleads Guilty To Robbery

A man pleaded guilty Monday morning to stealing money from a Yankton convenience store in February. The plea comes as part of a plea agreement with the Yankton County State's Attorney Office.

Nicholas Brandon Arneson had pleaded not guilty to robbery and grand theft charges in March. He was arrested March 3 and was accused of entering the Cork 'N' Bottle in the 1500 block of Broadway Avenue at 10:18 p.m. Feb. 26, pushing his way behind the counter and taking a box containing more than \$3,000.

Under the plea agreement, Arneson pleaded guilty to the grand theft charge, while the robbery charge was dismissed.

The state's attorney will recommend to the judge that the time served for this crime can run concurrently with Arneson's current prison sentence. Restitution to the victim will also be recommended.

When asked by Circuit Judge Glen Eng Monday what he did, Arneson responded, "I ran into Cork 'N' Bottle, grabbed the cash box and ran out."

He said the amount taken was \$3,100.

In an affidavit, Yankton Police Lt. Mark Payer said officers followed shoe prints left in fresh snow that led from where the suspect was seen running from the Cork 'N' Bottle to Arneson's home in the 900 block of Walnut Street. Arneson was picked up outside of Sioux Falls March 3 on a parole hold, and later confessed to Yankton police that he had committed the crime.

Grand theft is a Class 4 felony punishable by up to 10 years in the state penitentiary and/or a fine of \$20,000.

Arneson is scheduled to be sentenced July 11. He is currently being held at the Mike Durfee State Prison in Springfield.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mostly lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery dropped 16.25 cents to \$7.43 a bushel; July corn fell 4.5 cents to \$7.825 a bushel; July oats rose 5.5 cents to \$4.01 a bushel; while July soybeans fell 4.5 cents to \$13.8275 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle added 0.55 cent to \$1.0402 a pound; August feeder cattle gained 1.15 cent to \$1.2477 a pound; July lean hogs rose 0.30 cent to 93.52 cents a pound; while July pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.21 a pound.
