

Residents Warned To Stay Out Of Homes

PIERRE (AP) — State officials are discouraging displaced Pierre and Fort Pierre residents from re-occupying their homes and businesses just yet. Officials say many residents in areas where levees have protected property from the rising Missouri River are asking if they can return home. They're encouraging residents to consider their safety first and to remain out of their homes at this time.

Pierre Mayor Laurie Gill says the river flooding is a situation the city has faced, and officials continue to believe that areas where evacuations were encouraged remain unsafe.

Potential risks include failure of the levee system, a significant rain event or a sewage backup.

Lincoln Man Gets Probation In Case

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A 67-year-old Lincoln man has been given five years of probation for Social Security fraud.

A news release from the office of U.S. Attorney Deborah Gilg says Stanley Tryon was sentenced on Friday.

Tryon was indicted in June last year for theft of Social Security Supplemental Security Income and for lying to the agency about his eligibility.

According to Gilg's office, in November 2008 Tryon said in a statement that he owned no resources that would affect his eligibility. But at the time, Tryon owned real estate in Goehner that would have made him ineligible for the supplemental income from Social Security.

Tryon was ordered to pay restitution of nearly \$54,600.

Plan Devised For Road To New Casino

SIoux FALLS (AP) — A task force has approved a plan for future use of land along S.D. Highway 42 between Sioux Falls and the new Grand Falls Casino Resort across the Iowa border near Larchwood.

The Argus Leader reports that the Red Rock Corridor Task Force plan suggests more commercial, single-family housing and light industrial land uses in the heavily agricultural area.

Minnehaha County Planner Dustin Powers says the task force next month will discuss development standards such as requirements for billboards. Then the plan will go to the county planning commission and then to the county commission, which could include it in the county's comprehensive plan.

Such plans are used as guidelines in rezoning requests.

N.D. Has 1st Measles Case In 24 Years

BISMARCK, N.D. (AP) — North Dakota has its first confirmed case of the measles in nearly a quarter century.

State Health Department officials say in a statement Monday that the case is in a Cass County man who is in his 50s. They say he was not vaccinated and mostly likely caught the virus on an airline flight. He was not in North Dakota while contagious.

The last case of the measles in North Dakota was in 1987.

In South Dakota, the Mitchell Daily Republic says state health officials are reporting a case of measles in an adult from out of state who visited at least Pennington and Fall River counties in May. South Dakota hasn't had a reported case of measles in 14 years.

Missing S.D. Inmate Is Being Sought

SIoux FALLS (AP) — South Dakota authorities are searching for an inmate who walked away from the minimum-security unit at the State Penitentiary in Sioux Falls.

Thirty-seven-year-old Tony Ivory went missing Monday morning. He is black, 6 feet tall and about 300 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes.

Ivory is serving a six-year-sentence on a drug conviction out of Brown County.

Wild Card 2 Winning Ticket Sold In R.C.

PIERRE (AP) — A lottery ticket worth \$5,000 in Saturday's Wild Card 2 drawing was sold in Rapid City.

South Dakota Lottery officials say the ticket matched all five white ball numbers of 8, 13, 16, 19 and 23 but missed the Wild Card of the Jack of Hearts to win the game's second prize. The odds of winning are one in about 90,600.

Wild Card 2 is played in the Dakotas, Montana and Idaho. The jackpot for Wednesday's drawing sits at \$105,000.

Lincoln Robbers Leave Victim Naked

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Lincoln police say three men robbed a man and left him naked.

Lincoln television station KOLN/KGIN is reporting that the three pulled the man into a vehicle early Sunday morning.

He told police he felt a gun barrel pressed against the back of his head. He says he was ordered to give the robbers everything with him, including his clothes.

He did, and police say he soon was forced out of the vehicle naked.

The three men were wearing black masks.

Bachmann Enters Presidential Race

ST. PAUL, Minn. — Minnesota Rep. Michele Bachmann, an outspoken Republican with close ties to the tea party, announced Monday that she is running for president, a candidacy that could further shake up a volatile fight for the GOP nomination.

The first woman to enter the 2012 race, Bachmann announced her bid during a Republican presidential debate in New Hampshire. The third-term Minnesota congresswoman has been leaning heavily toward a run over the past few months, visiting early primary states, raising money and railing against President Barack Obama.

"Our country needs a leader who understands the hardships that people across America have

been facing over the past few years, and who will do what it takes to renew the American dream. We must become a strong and proud America again, and I see clearly a better path to a brighter future," Bachmann said in a statement issued through her new campaign.

She brings high energy, charisma and proven fundraising ability to the Republican race to nominate a challenger to Obama. She also is known for unyielding stances, biting commentary and high-profile gaffes.

Bachmann is attempting the rare leap from the U.S. House to the presidency.

Despite having low seniority and

few policy accomplishments, she has risen to prominence in Washington in part by her frequent television appearances and willingness to attack Obama in sharp terms.

Her popularity with tea party activists and her credentials as a social conservative make her a credible threat to other candidates courting conservatives who make up the core of the Republican Party. Her impact may be felt most in Iowa, the first stop in the nomination battle where Christian evangelicals dominate.

While she hasn't built the broad campaign infrastructure of some GOP rivals, she has gradually patched together a blend of tested and fresh-but-determined advisers. She's also shown an ability to raise money from a network of small-dollar donors, including \$13.5 million she put toward the nation's most

expensive House race of 2010.

Bachmann spent the bulk of her political career in Minnesota and Washington as a minority party member, reveling in her role as a fierce voice of the opposition. She didn't let up when Republicans gained control of the U.S. House last fall, enhancing her standing through public breaks with party leaders after she was denied a place in caucus leadership.

The camera-friendly congresswoman has irked some party leaders by grabbing at the spotlight, such as the alternate televised response she delivered to Obama's

State of the Union speech this winter.

Her willingness to speak her mind — she once accused Obama of running a "gangster government" — has brought her both loyal fans and plenty of critics.

Since first hinting at a presidential campaign ahead of an Iowa speech in January, she has made sustained trips there and to New Hampshire and South Carolina, all places with an outsized voice in the nominating process. She previously told reporters she would announce her intentions this month in her birthplace of Waterloo, Iowa.
