Morneau Headed To DL For Twins

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Just as Joe Mauer and Tsuyoshi Nishioka get closer to returning to the Minnesota Twins, Justin Morneau is headed to the disabled list.

The Twins placed their first baseman on the shelf on Tuesday night with a strained left wrist. General manager Bill Smith says Morneau's wrist will be immobilized for about 10 days, but the team did not ant-

icipate an extended stay on the DL.

On the bright side, Nishioka could return to the team as soon as Wednesday or Thursday after breaking his left leg in the sixth game of the season. Mauer is scheduled to face Joe Nathan in a light batting practice session on Wednesday.

BASEBALL

Jamestown College (N.D.) pitcher Alex Kreis is beginning his professional career in New York.

The Washington Nationals selected Kreis in the 35th round of the Major League Baseball draft last week. The Jamestown Sun newspaper reports that the Nationals are sending the Grand Forks native to play with the Auburn Doubledays, the Nationals' short-season Class A minor league team in the New York-Penn League. ... **A Nebraska Republican Party official says former President George W. Bush will attend the opening game of the 2011 College World Series in Omaha.** GOP chairman Mark Fahleson told the Omaha World-Herald that Bush is expected to throw the ceremonial first pitch at Saturday afternoon's game between Vanderbilt and North Carolina.

The Minnesota Timberwolves have scheduled their biggest day yet for pre-draft workouts.

Arizona forward Derrick Williams and Turkish big man Enes Kanter are scheduled to workout individually for the Wolves on Thursday. Minnesota holds the No. 2 pick in the draft, with lots of speculation that Williams will be the pick. But Kanter's size at 6-foot-11 could make him

an attractive option as well.

A former University of Nebraska football star is recovering from a gunshot wound at an Omaha hospital.

Omaha police say Tony Veland was shot about 9:15 p.m. Monday as he sat in a sport utility vehicle near Benson High School, where he was a prep star. No arrest has been reported. Authorities say Veland's wound is not believed to be life-threatening. ... **More than a decade after last meeting on the football field, Penn State and Pittsburgh will renew their rivalry with a home-and-home series for the 2016 and 2017 series.** Pitt will host the Nittany Lions at Heinz Field on Sept. 10, 2016. The next year, the Panthers will face Penn State in State College on Sept. 16, 2017. The two schools last played each other on Sept. 16, 2000, with the Panthers winning 12-0 at Three Rivers Stadium.

WRESTLING

Iowa State assistant wrestling coach Eric Voelker is resigning to pursue a career in the ministry.

Voelker, a former two-time NCAA champion for the Cyclones at 190 pounds, joined coach Kevin Jackson's staff last fall. Voelker says he's been moving toward a full-time career in the ministry for years. He is joining the staff at the Lutheran Church of Hope in West Des Moines.

Favre: Done With Football, Not Sure What's Next

HATTIESBURG, Miss. (AP) — Brett Favre says while his playing days are definitely over, he hasn't decided what he's going to do with himself in the coming years.

The three-time NFL Most Valuable Player hosted the "Brett Favre 7 on 7 at The Rock" football camp on the campus of Southern Miss, his alma mater, on Tuesday. He mingled with players and coaches in the nearly 100-degree heat, and occasionally squads would gather around the 41-year-old for a pep talk.

"I'm just one of the guys," Favre said. "And I enjoy it that way. If anything, that's what I want these kids to take away from this."

The 24-team camp for high school players was used to raise money for the quarterback's "Favre 4 Hope Foundation" and his "USM Brett Favre Scholarship" endowment.

Favre says he likes dealing with young players, citing their willingness to learn, but didn't want to be tied down by a full-time coaching commitment. He says he has enjoyed staying around Southern Miss but has "no plans right now and we'll see where that takes me."

Favre has made occasional appearances in his home state during the spring, including

throwing out the first pitch before a game during the Conference USA baseball tournament in Pearl.

The quarterback has famously flip-flopped about his playing future in the past, retiring with the Green Bay Packers in 2008 and the New York Jets in 2009 before deciding to play again. This time, it appears he's content to be a bystander.

"It's been a long time since I watched a high school football game, or a college game for that matter," Favre said. "I kind of look forward to it."

Favre played last season with the Minnesota Vikings, but his 20th year in the league was remembered more for injuries and off-the-field turmoil than results on the field. He threw just 11 touchdowns compared to 19 interceptions and his 69.9 quarterback rating was the lowest of his career.

DWU Softball Coach McCarthy-Foster To Leave

MITCHELL — After four seasons as the head softball coach at Dakota Wesleyan University, Marie McCarthy-Foster is leaving the university, athletic director Curt Hart announced this week.

McCarthy-Foster, who started at Dakota Wesleyan prior to the 2007 season, is moving to her home state of Michigan with her husband, Jason Foster, who took a job there. She will be staying in Mitchell until mid-July to help with the search for a new coach, which Hart said will begin immediately.

McCarthy-Foster leaves DWU as the winningest coach in Tiger softball history. She compiled a record of 48-97 in her four seasons, and coached 16 All-APAC selections as well as three NAIA Scholar-Athletes. Under her direction, the Tigers broke or tied 15 school team records, as well as numerous individual records. In 2011 alone, the Tigers set school records for runs (165), stolen base percentage (.891) and batting average (.296) in a season.
