**SEATTLE (AP)** — The Los Angeles Angels have given up on struggling left-hander Scott Kazmir, releasing the once promising starter.

Kazmir was released by the Angels on Wednesday as they closed out a three-game series in Seattle. Once considered among the most promising young starters in baseball, Kazmir has seen a rapid descent. He

made his fifth rehab start on Tuesday night at Triple-A Salt Lake and gave up six runs on five hits in just 1 2-3 innings. In five starts with Salt Lake, Kazmir had a 17.02 ERA in 15 1-3 innings, giving up 29 earned runs and 22 hits.

Kazmir made just one start for the Angels this season, giving up five earned runs in 1 2-3 innings on April 3 against Kansas City. He was placed on the disabled list April 8 with lower back soreness.

**Former Coyote A.D. Resigns At Fort Lewis**

**DURANGO, Colo.** — Former University of South Dakota athletic director Kelly Higgins resigned Wednesday as the A.D. at Fort Lewis College (Colo.), effective Aug. 31.

Higgins, a 1981 graduate of USD where he was a two-sport athlete, served as assistant vice president and athletic director from 1998-2004. Higgins became athletic director at Fort Lewis on March 1, 2008. Prior to coming to Durango, he served as associate athletic director at The American University, director of athletics and recreation at the University of Alaska, and consultant and athletic director at the University of the District of Columbia. He also served as assistant commissioner for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

Under Higgins' leadership, the Skyhawks at Fort Lewis won the 2009 NCAA Division II men's soccer championship and finished second in the 2010 NCAA DII women's basketball tournament. During this past academic year, Fort Lewis qualified for the NCAA playoffs in men's and women's basketball, women's soccer and men's golf, advancing to the Elite Eight in the latter two.

## UND Women's Swimming And Diving Joins WAC As Affiliate

**GRAND FORKS, N.D.** — University of North Dakota Director of Athletics Brian Faison is pleased to announce that UND has accepted an invitation to join the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) as an affiliate member in women's swimming and diving beginning with the 2011-12 season.

The announcement comes following the conclusion of the WAC's Board of Directors meeting in Park City, Utah.

Full-time member institutions of the WAC currently include Fresno State, Hawaii, Idaho, Louisiana Tech, Nevada, New Mexico State, State Jose State and Utah State. Denver, Seattle, Texas-San Antonio and Texas State will join the WAC as full-time members in 2012-13. Northern Arizona, like UND, is an affiliate member in women's swimming and diving.

UND's men's swimming and diving program will continue to compete in the Conference USA Championship as an invitee.

The WAC, located in Denver, was formed on July 27, 1962 and is the sixth oldest among the nation's 11 NCAA Division I-A conferences. Presently, the WAC crowns team and individual champions in 19 sports — eight men's and 11 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field. Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming

Dome in Vermillion.

"I've always felt like I should give something back," he said. "There were some adults who gave a lot when I was running, so I want to do the same thing."

Nelson has also been instrumental in the success of the Sioux Empire Football Officials Clinic, which will be holding its ninth annual session June 19-20 in Sioux Falls.

The clinic traditionally brings in NFL and NCAA Division I officials, including two who worked the 2011 BCS National Championship game (Bill LeMonnier and Dave Chesney).

"That's always been something that I've been proud of," Nelson said. "It's my way of giving back."

When it was announced that Nelson would be among those honored by the SDHSAA as a contest official, he said it was something far from his mind, instead claiming others before him should be recognized.

"It was absolutely a surprise,"

Nelson said. "I guess I'm flattered and honored. Some of the people in the past years and this year have made rather significant contributions, so to be included with them is a very nice thing."

To Kapitan, it wasn't exactly a surprise that someone like Nelson would earn a Distinguished Service Award, considering all the service work he has put into officiating.

"That's his biggest attribute," Kapitan said. "If you're going to be in this a long time, at any level, you have to have passion or you can't survive. They'll chew you up and spit you up. Dana has that."

"He wants so bad for people he becomes involved with to have that same passion," he added. "You do it for the love, the money isn't the final paycheck you get."

Nelson, who said he will recommend that he be honored during the Class AA state football championship game in November in Vermillion, firmly maintained that retirement isn't something he's ready to consider.

"I'm not at the point where I feel like I need to quit," he said, with a slight chuckle. "There are still some miles left in me. I've still got some fuel in the tank."

years. It applies in all 32 stadiums. If a fan uses obscene gestures or words, he may be removed from the stadium. This isn't about whether one guy gets charged and convicted of battery. This is about whether we're going to set some kind of precedent."

Goldsmith said he was given an opening when Prevost filed a motion asking the judge for a "finding of factual innocence" to have Ensign's arrest record cleared. Prevost said Ensign, a nurse, has been harmed by the allegations.

Goldsmith said the judge's ruling hasn't set a precedent.

"It just creates a chilling effect. If she grants the motion, we will appeal. Then it will be precedent," Goldsmith said.

"What this is about is, does the NFL have the right to evict fans who violate the code of conduct? If the answer is no, then this fellow and other fans can simply say, 'No, I'm not leaving,' and they can use violence to avoid eviction," Goldsmith said.

Prevost said Ensign "defended himself after he was attacked."

She also said Goldsmith is "desperate."

"We've already litigated every piece of it," Prevost said. "They lost and now they're trying to re-litigate it. You can't print something on a ticket and call it a contract. It's not enforceable. To have a contract, you have to have an offer and acceptance. What if they said, 'We want you to dance and do three cartwheels when you walk through the door?' You wouldn't have to if you didn't want to."

Prevost said the code of conduct "is a suggestion. It's not an order. The prosecution at trial tried to say the fan code of conduct is enforceable because it was hung over urinals. Could you imagine a man standing over a urinal and we now form a contract because we say, don't do anything obscene? They're
