Springfield Recreation Area Re-opens

SPRINGFIELD — The Springfield Recreation Area boat ramp and ten campsites have re-opened after a two-week closure brought on by the swollen Missouri River.

"We were able to open the 10 campsites and the playground in the north campground loop," said Shane Bertsch, District Park Supervisor. "The city's golf course which lies adjacent to the recreation area is open, and the camper dump station is now useable."

The south campground loop remains closed. The boat ramp is available, but Bertsch reminds fishermen to use caution while out on the water, as floating debris is a threat. The park was forced to close when the entrance road went under water on June 2.

"There is a clearly marked detour that will direct you into the park's temporary entrance," noted Bertsch.

son Wiseman." After some encouragement, Wiseman agreed.

The work was displayed in the front display window at the drug store for many years. After Beste died, Mrs. Beste had the painting cleaned and framed, according to her journals, by Whitmore Arts Goods Store of Omaha and it was displayed in their window for a short time.

As it happens when generations pass on, stories were lost and estates became divided up. For many years, descendants in the J.G. Beste and Grier families, unaware of the painting's origins, thought the work was of a family relative. They searched for any information.

Eventually, they turned to the history of the drug store in Hartington and found LeRoy Beste of Wynot in the phone book. J.G. Beste was his great uncle and the Beste family was also neighbors of the famous Wiseman family. The Grier family wanted to know if Beste could help them identify the painting.

"The first time we looked at it, I said to LeRoy, 'That has to be Henson,'" Beste's wife Sally said after they went to Omaha to see the painting.

Howe said this is the first time VCDC has undertaken a grant program of this nature, and that he is unaware of any similar programs elsewhere in the state or region.

"It would be nice if we were able to encourage other counties and communities to do that," he said. "Again, this is not just a Clay County issue. We're trying to make sure from a state perspective ... that we're taking care of our own, and that we're encouraging people who are displaced to stay here."

Wheat for July delivery tumbled 35.25 cents to \$6.7325 a bushel; July corn fell 24.25 cents to \$7.015 a bushel; July oats dropped 11.5 cents to \$3.56 a bushel; while July soybeans slid 17.5 cents to \$13.505 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle added 3 cents to \$1.0785 a pound; August feeder cattle gained 3 cents to \$1.2997 a pound; August lean hogs rose 0.70 cent to 95.22 cents a pound; while July pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.21 a pound.
