USD Alumni Dewald, Hoyt Run Well At Regional Races

DULUTH, Minn. — Former South Dakota cross country/track and field standout Matt Dewald placed 22nd out of 6,337 runners at Grandma's Marathon in Duluth, Minn. The event was held June 18.

Matt Hoyt, a member of the Coyote Sports Hall of Fame after an outstanding distance career at South Dakota, won the Run for Their Lives Half-Marathon on June 11 in Sioux Falls. The event is hosted by former Coyote standout Brianne Edwards and is held to raise money for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) education, awareness and research.

Dewald, a native of Yankton, ran a time of 2:22.06 at Grandma's, which begins in Two Harbors, Minn., and is run along Lake Superior before concluding in Duluth. Dewald's time was just three minutes away from the 2012 Olympic Marathon Trials Qualifying Standard.

Hoyt, currently an assistant coach for the Coyote track and field and cross country teams, ran a time of 1:15.25 to win the Run for Your Lives Half-Marathon, winning the event by more than four minutes.

USD Puts 22 On Summit Commissioner's List Of Academic Excellence

ELMHURST, Ill. — A total of 22 South Dakota swimmers and divers have been named to the Summit League's Commissioner's List of Academic Excellence, the league announced on Wednesday. The 22 honorees were the second most of any swimming and diving program in the Summit League, trailing only Oakland in that category.

In order for a student-athlete to be selected to the Commissioner's List of Academic Excellence, he/she must carry a 3.00 or better cumulative GPA, achieve sophomore academic standing at the institution, have used a year of eligibility and be on the squad list in the sport in which he/she is nominated. Transfers, graduate students and junior college graduates must have completed one academic year at the nominating institution. True freshmen, redshirt freshmen and first-year transfers are not eligible for the award.

The Commissioner's List differs from the Summit League Academic All-League Award, where selections are determined by an athlete's GPA for the semester in which they compete.

Eight of the 11 South Dakota women earning the honors were repeat selections from a year ago: sen-

S.D. Native Mark Ellis Returns For Athletics, But Weeks Staying At 2B

NEW YORK (AP) — The Oakland Athletics have activated second baseman Mark Ellis from the 15-day disabled list and optioned slumping first baseman Daric Barton to Triple-A Sacramento.

With the A's on a six-game winning streak, manager Bob Melvin chose to keep streaking rookie second baseman Jemile Weeks in the lineup for their game against the New York Mets on Wednesday night.

Weeks has hit safely in 10 of 13 games since being called up to fill in for Ellis on June 7. He's hitting .362 with a 400 on-base percentage and four steals, sparking the ballclub during the winning streak by going 9 for 22 (.409).

Ellis "made it very easy on me," Melvin said of the decision to start Weeks. "First thing I said to him was, 'the second base situation.' Well, he said, 'That's an easy one. You got to play him.' I want to win, too."

The only thing Melvin told Weeks was, "to keep playing."

Ellis was hitting .213 with one homer and 15 RBIs in 58 games before pulling his right hamstring.

Melvin said Ellis, Oakland's longest-tenured player, will work out at second base, third base and first base so he can get more playing time.

Barton was hitting just .212 without a homer and 21 RBIs in 67 games. His slugging percentage of .267 was second lowest in the majors. He has committed eight errors, which leads all big league first basemen.

According to its presentation to the BOR, USD is also suggesting the board to appoint a building committee representative to oversee development of the project.

In the case of South Dakota State, it will request approval of its own facility statement for a new football stadium, with a capacity increase to 20,000.

The 50-year-old Coughlin Alumni Stadium seats 10,000 people, but the Jackrabbits have averaged over 13,000 fans since joining the Division I level.

According to SDSU's report to the Board of Regents, the new stadium will feature a new synthetic turf, visiting team locker room facilities, coaching and media facilities and restrooms. The proposed location would be on the site occupied by Coughlin.

SDSU athletic director Justin Sell was out of the office for the week and was unavailable for comment.

The process for getting BOR approval is the same for any facility project, according to Monte Kramer, the board's system vice president for Finance and Administration.

"The campuses are wanting to move forward with their facility statements and they can't move forward until they get the permission from the board," Kramer said Wednesday. "It's the same process we use with all facility projects across our schools."

"Until they get through this process, there's not much in the way of planning and investigation that can be done in terms of buildings and costs."

Discussion on both projects is scheduled for next Wednesday, Kramer said.

While Saylor and his department staff, namely associate athletic director David Herbster, have been able to officially raise money for the new arena and Dome renovations, they understand the priorities, Saylor said.

"At the end of the day, we know there are a lot of other issues to worry about, especially right now in our area with the flooding," he said. "I get where

the importance ranks with something like this. But at the same time, the longer it keeps getting put off, the more expensive something like this becomes."

According to USD's 2015 Master Plan for Athletic Facilities, the first phase would be the new basketball/volleyball arena, which would have a seating capacity of 6,000.

The facility, which would be connected on the south end of the Dome, would include a new basketball court, three practice courts, basketball and volleyball coaches offices, administrative offices, a new training room, 14 luxury boxes/suites and the Kinology and Sport Science (KSS) program.

The second phase would include renovations to the Dome,

highlighted by an effort to improve the football atmosphere. Changes would include new wider and more open concourses, new concession stands and restrooms, a new turf, expanded locker rooms and expanded coaches and press boxes.

Additional seats would be added to the south end zone, and permanent seats would go where the current retractable bleachers are on the west side.

"Our project is a little more stage driven," Saylor said. "The arena would need to come first so we can move our stuff out of the Dome."

"It could be three-to-five years for us, it's hard to say right now until we can start raising money."
