BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures dropped Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for September delivery fell 8.25 cents to \$6.61 a bushel; December corn tumbled 14 cents to \$6.32 a bushel; December oats sank 13.25 cents to \$3.48 a bushel; while November soybeans slid 8 cents to \$13.0925 a bushel.  
Meanwhile, beef futures rose while pork prices dropped on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
August live cattle rose 0.78 cent to \$1.1350 a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.75 cent to \$1.3860 a pound; August lean hogs slid 0.70 cent to 95.20 cents a pound; while August pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.065 a pound.
