Fort Randall Dam Sets Elevation Record

PICKSTOWN — As project manager Tom Curran had predicted, Fort Randall Dam has set a new elevation record because of Missouri River flooding.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced Monday a rise in Fort Randall reservoir elevations

from 1,365 feet June 20 to a record level of 1,372.5 feet June 27. The new record reflected a 0.6-foot increase in the preceding 24 hours.

The previous record for Fort Randall was 1,372.2 feet in 1997. Sunday's releases also hit a record 154,200 cubic feet per second (cfs). The Corps plans to increase releases to 157,000 cfs.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery fell 10.25 cents to \$6.5075 a bushel; December corn fell 5.25 cents to \$6.2675 a bushel; December oats sank 7 cents to \$3.41 a bushel; while November soybeans rose 5.75 cents to \$13.15 a bushel.

Beef futures also mostly fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle fell 2.13 cents to \$1.1137 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 1.38 cents to \$1.3722 a pound; August lean hogs slid 2.85 cents to \$2.35 cents a pound; while August pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.065 a pound.
