Twins' Young Has Bone Bruise In Right Ankle
MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Twins outfielder Delmon Young has a bone bruise in his right ankle. Young underwent an MRI on Monday to determine the extent of his ankle injury after he collided with the left-field wall in Milwaukee on Saturday and had to be carted off the field. He was placed on the 15-day disabled list Sunday with what was classified as an ankle sprain.

Twins manager Ron Gardenhire says Young isn't expected to miss more than the required 15 days. Young is hitting .256 this season with two homers and 20 RBIs in 55 games. Minnesota hosted the Los Angeles Dodgers on Tuesday night.

Man Sentenced For Baseball Camp Scam

RAPID CITY (AP) — A man who admitted convincing South Dakota families and businesses out of tens of thousands of dollars through a bogus baseball camp scheme has been sentenced to serve 10 years in prison. Jason Anderson also was ordered to pay back more than \$46,000, the Rapid City Journal reported. Anderson, 35, collected money from Rapid City area parents and businesses last year for a baseball camp and traveling baseball team that never materialized. He pleaded guilty in late May to grand theft by embezzlement, admitting to using the money to support a drug and gambling habit. Parent Heath Boetker told Judge Nanine Kern on Monday that Anderson's scam has turned his son away from the game.

"My son had a pretty promising baseball career. At this point, he doesn't want to play baseball anymore," Boetker said. Anderson addressed the families in the courtroom. "I was wrong," he said. "I'm sorry. There's nothing I can do to take it back. I'm sorry for ruining your dreams. I lied." Pennington County prosecutor Scott Roetzl asked Kern to suspend all but five years of Anderson's prison sentence so he could begin making restitution as soon as possible. Defense attorney Arnie Laubach made a similar request. Kern refused, saying Anderson had done enormous harm to the community. She was disturbed by Anderson's letter to her in which he talked of a desire to work with teenagers, teaching them self-control and commitment and promoting himself as someone who has overcome adversity. "That smacks of con-like behavior," the judge said.

Warriors Buy D-League Dakota Wizards

NEW YORK (AP) — The Golden State Warriors have bought the Dakota Wizards, becoming the fourth NBA team to own and operate its NBA Development League affiliate. Golden State will fully control the team's business and basketball operations beginning with the 2011-12 season. The Warriors will be the sole NBA affiliate of the Wizards. The Lakers (Los Angeles D-Fenders), Oklahoma City

Thunder (Tulsa 66ers) and San Antonio Spurs (Austin Toros) also fully own and operate their D-League affiliates. The Warriors are the eighth NBA team to have an exclusive affiliation with a team in the D-League, the official minor league of the NBA. Dakota was affiliated with the Memphis Grizzlies and Washington Wizards during the 2010-11 season. Their D-League affiliates will be announced later.

UND Group Backs President's Call On Nickname

GRAND FORKS, N.D. (AP) — Members of the University of North Dakota's University Senate executive committee are backing President Robert Kelley's call for an end to the dispute over the school's Fighting Sioux nickname. Kelley last week said the Legislature should rescind a law requiring UND to keep the nickname. The NCAA finds it offensive and says UND will face sanctions if the school continues to use it. UND also is likely to have problems joining the Big Sky Conference if it keeps the nickname. The University Senate includes faculty, staff, student and administration representatives. It for years has favored retiring the nickname. It opposed the bill in the state Senate earlier this year. The Grand Forks Herald reports that the executive committee has now sent a letter to Kelley backing his request to lawmakers.

Platte Native Hired At Fox Run Golf Course

The City of Yankton and Fox Run Golf Course announced Tuesday the hiring of Kevin Doby, PGA Class-A Golf Professional, as the Fox Run professional and clubhouse manager. Doby, who takes over for Scott Larson, will begin his duties on Wednesday, July 13. Doby is originally from Platte and is a University of South Dakota graduate. He was most recently a golf lessons instructor and sales associate at Golf Galaxy in Omaha, Neb. Prior to his work at Golf Galaxy, Doby had been the Golf Professional at Bent Tree Golf Club in Council Bluffs, Iowa. His work experience also includes being an assistant Golf Professional at Lakeshore Country Club in Council Bluffs, Iowa; assistant Golf Professional at Piney Point Golf Club in Norwood, N.C.; and assistant Golf Professional at Long Bay Club in Myrtle Beach, S.C. Doby has been an active member in the Nebraska Section of the PGA and has had his professional status since 1993. Doby and his family will be moving to Yankton from Omaha. hind the plate, Allan admits that there was a "rough patch" between the two, in terms of what pitches to call or certain situations. "I'm still young and stubborn-headed, so it took me about two years to finally realize that I need to listen to him," Allan said. "We've grown on each other. But when I do something wrong, I definitely feel a little more disappointment in his eyes or in his voice." When told of that comment by his brother, Brett chuckled and said, "Only when he stops wanting to play will I get upset." Brett went on to describe the many nights as a child when he would tag along with his grandfather, father and uncle while they played amateur baseball. "I grew up at the ballpark in the summer, sometimes six nights a week I was there messing around with buddies," Brett said. "I've always enjoyed playing. "I've always told people, your worst day at the field is still a day at the field." Just as Brett has influenced Allan's baseball career, the efforts of the older men in the family have influenced the Scherschligt brothers. Both

grandparents are in the South Dakota Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame, and there was a time when their grandfather caught for them father. "It's in our blood to play baseball," Allan said. "It definitely

adds something special. Not many people get to have a family member behind the plate to have that connection."
