With an initiated measure on the 2012 general election ballot that proposes to increase the state general sales and use tax rate from 4 percent to 5 percent to, in part, help fund K-12, there is some uncertainty in regards to the future of education funding. What do you think of current funding levels, and what is the way for-

I am not in favor of increasing taxes although I support the right of the taxpayers to use the initiative process. South Dakota needs to take the uncertainty out of education funding. We can't continue to say that our children are our greatest asset yet leave education funding as one of the last items to be decided each year. Schools need a long term solution that they can rely upon not the typical last minute annual financial patch job. We need a new funding system based upon an old concept: the best decisions about government are made closest to home. Prior to the new funding system, Yankton School District provided the best education with one of the lowest cost per pupil ratio in the state.

3. The general election ballot will include Referred Law 14, which would determine whether or not the Large Project Development Fund will be formed to assist with the construction of economic development projects. Is this fund needed? Why or why not?

Providing business incentives is not a new idea. South Dakota and our neighboring states have been doing it for years, as well as our own local municipalities. In order for our state to compete, we need to be aggressive about providing support to companies who are willing to either start their business or relocate to South Dakota. We can't afford not to compete for these economic opportunities. Who doesn't agree that we need to create new and better paying jobs? Who doesn't want their children to find a job closer to home? These are potential jobs that we are losing to other states. One can argue about what projects should be funded and for how much, but not the concept of economic development.

4. Do you think South Dakota's economy is heading in the right direction? Should the state be doing more/less to assist with growth efforts?

The national recession has affected every state's economy. Through some painful cuts made during the last legislative session, South Dakota does not have a budget deficit like other states do. Continuing to keep our taxes low and having a strong work ethic, our state has a great economic future. We need to be aware of the importance that agriculture plays in our economy. We also need to diversify our economic opportunities. We must continue to promote a business environment where private business can thrive but not at the cost of our taxpavers or the environment. Our economy will thrive if we depend more on private enterprise as opposed to depending upon government to create jobs through government programs. Our business community needs fewer laws passed.

5. Final thoughts?

In 1975 my late wife Deb and I chose Yankton to raise a family. My daughters Sophie and Sadie got a great education in Yankton. My family is dedicated to the Yankton community.
