Cedar County Authorities Investigating Break-Ins

WYNOT, Neb. — The Cedar County Sheriff's office is investigating a pair of break-ins at the Wynot, Neb., school that resulted in the loss of high-tech equipment valued at thousands of dollars.

The sheriff's office is also investigating break-ins at the Green Diamond business in St. James, Neb., and two residential cabins.

Sheriff Larry Koranda said the first break-ins occurred during Memorial Day weekend, followed by the other break-ins last weekend.

He is looking at the possibility that the events may be related.

The Wynot school break-in apparently targeted large equipment, Koranda said.

"The school reported (the theft of) a high-tech camera and a big screen TV," the sheriff said. "They put the value at \$8,000 to \$10,000."

The school reported the equipment was used for its dis-

tribute-learning program, according to the Cedar County News.

Wynot school officials and staff conducted further checks for any other stolen items, but nothing further has been reported missing, Koranda said.

The Green Diamond theft consisted of alcohol, cigarettes and candy, the sheriff said. He was unsure why the theft targeted those items.

Koranda declined to disclose the method of entry in the break-ins.

The Cedar County News reported that entry to the Wynot school was gained with a crow bar used to pry open the back door of the gym. Entry to the Green Diamond was gained when the door was broken and pried open, the newspaper reported.

Wynot school principal Rich Higgins could not be reached for comment Thursday.
