BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for July delivery fell 14 cents to \$6.0950 a bushel; July corn fell 22 cents to \$5.7950 a bushel; July oats rose 2 cents to \$3.0775 a bushel; while July soybeans fell 10 cents to \$13.76 a bushel.  
Beef futures fell while pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
August live cattle fell 0.37 cent to \$1.1665 a pound; August feeder cattle slipped 0.18 cent to \$1.5602 a pound; while July lean hogs fell 1.50 cent to 93.02 cents a pound.
