City: Check Property For Tall Grass And Weeds

The City of Yankton reminds property owners to check their property for weeds and tall grass.

Overgrown grass and weeds aren't just unsightly; they're a violation of city ordinance.

Grass should be maintained at 8 inches or lower and yards free of noxious weeds. Weeds must be cut or chemically treated.

Properties with grass not maintained at 8 inches or lower or containing noxious weeds may be cut by the City of Yankton and the cost of maintenance assessed to the property.

Beef fell, while pork prices rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle rose 0.95 cent to \$1.2130 a pound; August feeder cattle rose 0.15 cent to \$1.4432 a pound; June lean hogs added 0.30 cent to 95.62 cents a pound.

State, FEMA Set To Offer Training On How To Process Disasters

PIERRE — Local and tribal officials and private nonprofit groups are being encouraged to attend a short course on the process of administering disaster declarations.

The course, "Public Assistance Pocket Guide," will offer guidance to officials with tribes, local governments and private nonprofit groups in the revised method for crafting public assistance projects after a disaster declaration is received. The course includes information on combining similar items of work, relying on professional estimates and maximizing time and effort in implementing the public assistance program.

The course is aimed primarily at officials who will be responsible for working with the state Office of Emergency Management and FEMA after Presidential disaster declarations.

The four-hour course is free. Classes are scheduled:

• June 4 — 8 a.m.-noon CDT, Morningside Community Center, 2400 S. Bahnson St., Sioux Falls.

• June 6 — 8 a.m.-noon CDT, Fire Station No. 1, 129 1st Ave. NW, Watertown.

• June 10 — 8 a.m.-noon MDT, University Center, 4300 Cheyenne Blvd., Rapid City.
