Doerr Named Academic All-District

WAYNE, Neb. — Mickey Doerr of Wayne State College has been selected to the Capital One Academic All-District VII Men's Track/Cross Country First Team as voted on by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Doerr now advances to the Division II Academic All-American ballot.



Doerr, a junior from Bloomfield, Neb. (Bloomfield HS), is a repeat selection to the All-District VII First Team after recording a perfect 4.00 grade point average majoring in history and science education. Doerr is a sprinter on the Wildcat men's track and field team, placing a season-best second in the 200 meter dash at the Mount Marty Twilight Meet with a time of 22.76 seconds. He also had season-best times of 11.41 seconds in the 100 meter dash (UNL Pre Drake Meet) and 51.55 seconds in the 400 meter dash at the Nebraska Invite. Doerr also ran a leg on the 4x400 meter relay team that finished seventh at the NSIC Outdoor Championships.

Last season, Doerr was a Capital One Academic All-American as he received Third Team honors along with being named All-District VII First Team.
