Rummage Signs Must Be On Private Property

The City of Yankton is reminding residents that rummage or yard sales signs, advertising signs, posters, or notices of any kind must be posted on private property.
For the safety of all drivers and pedestrians signs cannot be posted in boulevards, attached to utility poles, street signs, street trees, light poles, or be placed in parks.
A good general rule is to keep signs to the inside (house side) of the public sidewalk or 15 feet from the roadside curb if there is no sidewalk. Signs posted in the public right of way will be removed.

Chief Master Sergeant Lloyd Vellek Retires

Chief Master Sergeant Lloyd Vellek, son of Larry and Leona Vellek of Scotland, retired May 2, 2013 from the United States Air Force and the Oklahoma Air National Guard after almost 25 years of service. Chief Vellek had most recently served as the Force Support Squadron Superintendent of the 138th Fighter Wing in Tulsa, Okla., for the past two and half years.
Chief Vellek entered active duty Air Force in October 1988. After basic training at Lackland AFB, he was stationed at Ellsworth AFB in Box Elder, working in the Logistics Readiness Squadron (LRS). He had a short stay at Elgin AFB in Florida while awaiting orders to Anderson AFB in Guam, where he also worked in the LRS. Chief Vellek separated from active duty in July 1992.
He entered the South Dakota Air National Guard in Sioux Falls in November 1992 and worked in the LRS until May 2003, when he moved to Oklahoma and joined the Air National guard in Tulsa.
While with the Oklahoma Air National Guard, Chief Vellek was promoted to First Sergeant with
