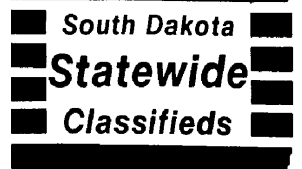

Instead, the Fordyce proclamation was read on the Cedar County courthouse steps at 10 a.m. Saturday morning and was then taken by horse over the 10-mile journey to Fordyce.

Each of the 11 riders went in half-mile increments, and everyone rode twice.

"It's not near what the real Pony Express history was," said Matt Burbach, who along with his father, Tim, helped organize the horse endeavor. "The Pony Express guys used to ride for about 10 miles, and they would switch a horse. At every station, they would switch horses for 10 miles. Ours is a lot different."

The parade, which lasted about an hour, followed a route from 585th Avenue south, then east on Fourth Street and back north through Main Street up to the north edge of town.

"All these centennials are very cool; this one was a great turnout," Burbach said. "It's always fun coming into town and seeing all the people. Everybody loves the support. It's a big deal for these towns."

Like Hartington before it, Fordyce's celebration was the latest in a string of commemorations to feature the Pony Express redux. Randolph and St. Helena have previously used riders and proclamations, and Belden will likely do the same thing in a couple of years, Burbach said.

Fordyce's day-long celebration began at 7 a.m. with a 5K run/walk, and ran all day to a street dance at 9 p.m., which was eventually moved to the town hall because of rain.

Other events included a history/quilt display, food booths, a horse shoe tournament, a scavenger hunt, Taekwondo, kids games, a polka band, church tours and a fashion show/judging.

Coordinating such a day was rather hectic, Wiebelhaus said. "The last couple of weeks were

crazy, but the last couple days before (Saturday), everything came together," she said. "We had a lot of volunteers helping out."

"It's just overwhelming to see all these people in this little small town." One such person who saw firsthand what it was like to see her town overrun with visitors was JoAnn Wiebelhaus. She has lived in Fordyce for 22 years.

"It's wonderful that we can get all these people here," she said. "We have only 130 people in our town, so this is a big deal for us."

Wiebelhaus, who lives one block west of Main Street, said she helped set up games and other nearby booths, as did many of her fellow Fordyce citizens.

"The parade was awesome — so good for our community," she said. "There were so many other floats and things from surrounding towns. That kind of support was great."

not true.

"Any analyst at any time can target anyone. Any selector. Anywhere. Where those communications will be picked up depends on the range of those sensor networks and the authority that that analyst is empowered with," Snowden said, in accompanying video on the *Guardian's* website. "Not all analysts have the power to target anything. But I, sitting at my desk, had the authority to wiretap anyone, from you or your accountant to a federal judge to even the president if I had a personal email."

He told the *Post* that he would "ask for asylum from any countries that believe in free speech and oppose the victimization of global privacy" in an interview from Hong Kong, where he is staying.

"I'm not going to hide," Snowden told the *Post*. "Allowing the U.S. government to intimidate its people with threats of retaliation for revealing wrongdoing is contrary to the public interest."

The *Post* declined to elaborate on its reporting about Snowden. Spokespeople for the White House, the Director of National Intelligence, NSA and CIA did not

have immediate comment on the disclosures, nor would they confirm whether Snowden worked at the U.S. intelligence agencies.

In a statement, Booz Allen confirmed that Snowden "has been an employee of our firm for less than 3 months, assigned to a team in Hawaii." The statement said if the news reports of what he has leaked prove accurate, "this action represents a grave violation of the code of conduct," and the company promised to work closely with authorities on the investigation.

Director of National Intelligence James Clapper has decried the revelation of the intelligence-gathering programs as reckless and said it has done "huge, grave damage." In recent days, he took the rare step of declassifying some details about them to respond to media reports about counterterrorism techniques employed by the government.

Snowden told *The Guardian* that he lacked a high school diploma and enlisted in the U.S. Army until he was discharged because of an injury, and later worked as a security guard with the NSA.

He later went to work for the CIA as an information technology employee and by 2007 was stationed in Geneva, Switzerland, where he had access to classified documents.

During that time, he considered going public about the na-

tion's secretive programs but told the newspaper he decided against it, because he did not want to put anyone in danger and he hoped Obama's election would curtail some of the clandestine programs.

He said he was disappointed that Obama did not rein in the surveillance programs.

"Much of what I saw in Geneva really disillusioned me about how my government functions and what its impact is in the world," he told *The Guardian*. "I realized that I was part of something that was doing far more harm than good."

Snowden left the CIA in 2009 to join a private contractor, and spent last four years at the NSA, as a contractor with consulting giant Booz Allen Hamilton and, before that, Dell.

The Guardian reported that Snowden was working in an NSA office in Hawaii when he copied the last of the documents he planned to disclose and told supervisors that he needed to be away for a few weeks to receive treatment for epilepsy.

He left for Hong Kong on May

20 and has remained there since, according to the newspaper. Snowden is quoted as saying he chose that city because "they have a spirited commitment to free speech and the right of political dissent", and because he believed it was among the spots on the globe that could and would resist the dictates of the U.S. government.

"I feel satisfied that this was all worth it. I have no regrets," Snowden told *The Guardian*, which said he asked to be identified after several days of interviews.

Snowden could face decades in a U.S. jail for revealing classified information if he is successfully extradited from Hong Kong, said Mark Zaid, a national security lawyer who represents whistleblowers. Hong Kong has an extradition treaty with the United States that took force in 1998, according to the U.S. State Department website.

"If it's a straight leak of classified information, the government could subject him to a 10 or 20 year penalty for each count," with each document leaked considered a separate charge, Zaid said.

To that end, the shelter hired a part-time veterinary tech last November, which Schmidt said lessened its medical costs.

A common misconception about the shelter, Schmidt said, is that people believe the adoption fees are too high. The price — which includes care of the animals — is still lower than it would be at a vet clinic, she said.

Another problem that the shelter faces is when people find litters of kittens and assume they were either abandoned by the mother or

dumped by the owner.

"The mothers transfer them one at a time; they're not just left on the side of the road," Schmidt said. "People need to leave them alone. Don't take them inside."

To help keep up with the number of cats to take care of, the shelter is seeking volunteers, specifically for after-hour work.

Heartland Humane Society currently has 12 "solid" volunteers and about 20 foster homes, Schmidt said.

"We just want to spread the word that our cats are healthy and cared for," Schmidt said. "We have some great animals here who need great homes."

Grand Island City Finance Director Accused Of DUI

GRAND ISLAND, Neb. (AP)— Grand Island's city finance director has been arrested on suspicion of driving under the influence after a hit-and-run crash.

Jaye Monter, 51, of Cairo, Neb., was arrested Friday for driving under the influence, refusal to submit to a preliminary breath test, leaving the scene of an accident and flight to avoid arrest, which are all misdemeanors, according to Hall County Chief Deputy Sheriff Chris Rea.

Monter was arrested after a Hall County sheriff's deputy witnessed the hit-and-run on U.S. Highway 2, The Grand Island Independent reported.

Authorities say the deputy turned to follow Monter and activated his overhead lights, but Monter failed to stop. The deputy stopped pursuing the vehicle but alerted area law enforcement to be on the lookout. According to the Nebraska State Patrol,

a trooper stopped Monter's Kia Sorento in Cairo shortly before 9:30 p.m. and arrested her.

She was booked into the Hall County Jail around 11:15 p.m. Friday, according to the State Patrol.

Online records indicate Monter was released from jail on her own recognition Saturday. A personal phone number listed for Monter in Cairo was disconnected Sunday.

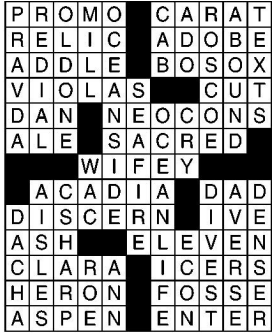
Monter became the city's finance director in February 2012 on the recommendation of Grand Island Mayor Jay Vavricek. She had been serving as the city's interim finance director since September 2011 and, at that time, had worked in the city's Finance Department for 11 years.

Monter's husband, Gary, 53, died May 19. He had been the superintendent for Palmer Public Schools since 2007.

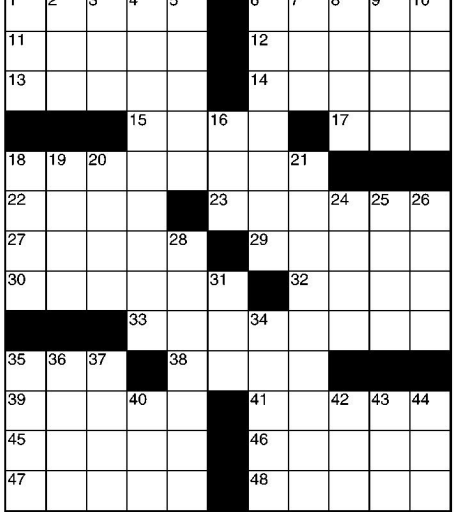
