Eng if he had any questions about the charges against him. Gilbaugh currently is in the

Clay County Jail on a \$5,000 bond, and although he has sisters — who live in Kansas and Detroit, respectively — neither of them are able to post it.

Public defender Jason Rumpsa, Gilbaugh's attorney, said his client suffers from numerous health conditions, including stage four kidney failure and reduced lung capacity, and that he is in a pre-cancerous stage of prostate cancer.

Gilbaugh is unable to maintain his various health-related needs

in prison, Rumpsa said. States Attorney Teddi Gertsma argued that Gilbaugh's bond should stay as it is, as he 'doesn't really have any ties to

the community.' "I'm sympathetic to his health issues," Gertsma said. "I would just like some assurances that he is going to appear (in court)."

Eng agreed, stating that Gilbaugh is a potential danger to society because of the nature of the charges against him. (The bond) is not excessive

in any manner, and will not be modified," Eng said. Gilbaugh's motion hearing will be at 11 a.m., July 9. If a plea

agreement is reached, a hearing will be on or before Sept. 3.

If no agreement is reached, Gilbaugh's jury trial is set for
