Yankton Post Office To Be Auctioned Off

The former post office in downtown Yankton is slated to hit the auction block soon, according to a U.S. Postal Service (USPS) official.  
“We are using the General Services Administration (GSA) to market the Yankton Post Office and 18 other properties that have been on the market for a period of time and have not yet sold,” said Peter Nowacki, a spokesman for the USPS. “The auction for this particular property has not gone live yet. We expect that to happen soon but do not have a date.”  
Nowacki said the remaining

properties are mostly east of the Mississippi, and Yankton is the only real estate in South Dakota and bordering states.  
The post office at 335 Walnut Street was built in 1905. The USPS closed the building in January 2012 and put it up for sale. Postal operations were consolidated into the annex at 506 West 25th Street. That facility was built in 2000.  
At this point, it is unclear what type of auction the GSA will have for the post office. Options include an online auction, a public auction or a sealed bid auction.

U.S. Navy Capt. (retired) Debra Bodenstedt will be the program speaker for the Yankton Elks Lodge annual June 14 Flag Day program at 5 p.m. Friday in the new Elks Lodge home at 504 West 27th Street Friday. Bodensedt was born and raised in Nebraska but has made her home in Yankton the past two years. She was a high school teacher in Wayne and Wisner before joining the U.S. Navy in 1982.  
She received her commission from Officer Candidate School and was trained as a surface warfare officer and deep sea diver. Her Naval career spans 28 years and covers assignments on three ships and travels to 31 countries. She became the first woman to qualify as a submarine rescue chamber operator while assigned to USS Kittiwake. She also was a diver on the space shuttle Challenger salvage.  
Bodenstedt holds master's degrees in business administration from St. Ambrose University and National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College. She is a member of the Women Divers Hall of Fame and the Women's Memorial. She is currently the manager of the Yankton office, American Red Cross and a member of Yankton Elks Lodge.

Eng if he had any questions about the charges against him.  
Gilbaugh currently is in the Clay County Jail on a \$5,000 bond, and although he has sisters — who live in Kansas and Detroit, respectively — neither of them are able to post it.  
Public defender Jason Rumpsa, Gilbaugh's attorney, said his client suffers from numerous health conditions, including stage four kidney failure and reduced lung capacity, and that he is in a pre-cancerous stage of prostate cancer.  
Gilbaugh is unable to maintain his various health-related needs

in prison, Rumpsa said.  
States Attorney Teddi Gertsma argued that Gilbaugh's bond should stay as it is, as he “doesn't really have any ties to the community.”  
“I'm sympathetic to his health issues,” Gertsma said. “I would just like some assurances that he is going to appear (in court).”  
Eng agreed, stating that Gilbaugh is a potential danger to society because of the nature of the charges against him.  
“(The bond) is not excessive in any manner, and will not be modified,” Eng said.  
Gilbaugh's motion hearing will be at 11 a.m., July 9. If a plea agreement is reached, a hearing will be on or before Sept. 3.  
If no agreement is reached, Gilbaugh's jury trial is set for Sept. 23.
