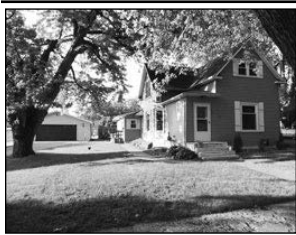

YANKTON WATER SUPPLY PROJECT

The City of Yankton is seeking up to **\$26,000,000.00** of funding from the Board of Water and Natural Resources to improve its water system. The project will consist of constructing a new collector well at Paddlewheel Point to augment water supplied to the city from the Missouri River and the Nebraska well field. The funds could be either a grant from the state Consolidated Water Facilities Construction Program or a loan from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) Program. The expected Drinking Water SRF loan terms are 3.0 percent for 20 years, and the Board of Water and Natural Resources may forgive all or a portion of the loan principal. The amount, source of funds, and terms will be determined by the Board of Water and Natural Resources when the application is presented at a scheduled board meeting. The purpose of the public hearing is to discuss the proposed project, the proposed financing, and the source of repayment for the loan. The public is invited to attend and comment on the project.

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The public hearing will be held at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st Street, Room 114 on June 24, 2013 at 7:00 PM. Notice is given that Karl M Schenk, 44352 308th St, Mission Hill SD 57046 has filed an application for a water permit to appropriate 1.78 cubic feet of water per second from one well to be completed into the Lower James:Missouri Aquifer (150 feet deep) located in the E 1/2 SW 1/4 Section 25 for irrigation of 70 acres located in the E 1/2 SW 1/4 Section 25; all in T94N-R55W. The applicant is requesting a diversion rate greater than the statutory limit.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends APPROVAL of Application No. 7819-3 because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on this application, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the application or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. If a petition opposing the application or contesting the recommendation is filed, then a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider this application. Notice of the hearing will be given to the applicant and any person filing a petition.

Any person interested in opposing or supporting this application or recommendation must file a written petition with BOTH the applicant and Chief Engineer. The applicant must file a petition if contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING
June 4, 2013

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Bruce Jensen at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 4, 2013 at the Commission Chambers in the County Government Center. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll call was taken with the following members present: Donna Freng, Bruce Jensen, Garry Moore and Allen Sinclair. Absent: Mark Johnson.

Also present at the start of the meeting were the following county officials: Emergency Management Director Paul Scherschligt, Highway Superintendent Brian Gustad, Director of Equalization Lori Mackey, Deputy Director of Equalization Matt Archer and Register of Deeds Brian Hunhoff (meeting recorder).

Action 13260C: A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Freng to approve the meeting agenda with the following additions: Discussion with Jim Means about Mead Building project, and discussion about merging the Auditor and Treasurer offices. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 13261C: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Sinclair to approve minutes from the May 21, 2013 regular meeting and the May 24, 2013 special meeting. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Commissioner Johnson joined the meeting at 2:15 p.m.

Budget Hearings: The Board began hearings for the 2014 budget. Deputy Auditor Patty Hojem earlier advised department heads to budget a maximum three percent increase in wages and a maximum three percent increase in operating expenses for 2014. That recommendation was based on a 1.62 percent increase in Yankton County assessed value; and a 2.1 percent increase in the Consumer Price Index over the past calendar year. Based on state law, those combined figures mean the

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County General Fund budget can only be increased by 3.72 percent in 2014. The current General Fund budget is \$5,069,019. Increasing that amount by 3.72 percent would allow an increase of \$188,567 for 2014.

Emergency Management Budget: Emergency Management Director Scherschligt presented a proposed 2014 budget of \$219,287; which represents a .24 percent increase of \$523 over the current year EM budget of \$218,764. Scherschligt proposed a 3 percent wage increase for his deputies and a \$2.00 per hour (9.3 percent) wage increase for his position. The 9.3 percent raise would increase Scherschligt's salary by \$4,120 from \$44,480 to \$48,600. The EM Director also proposed cutting his machinery and auto equipment budget from \$48,975 to \$31,651.

DOE Budget: Director of Equalization Mackey presented a proposed 2014 budget of \$372,900; which represents a 3 percent increase of \$10,900 over the current year DOE budget of \$362,000. Mackey proposed cutting her utilities, repairs and maintenance line items by a total of \$6,300. She requested a 3 percent wage increase for five of the six staff members in her office; and requested a 12 percent wage increase for Deputy DOE Matt Archer in recognition of his job performance. The 12 percent raise would increase Archer's salary by \$4,611 from \$38,424 to \$43,035.

Highway Dept. Budget: Highway Supt. Gustad presented a proposed 2014 Road and Bridge budget of \$4,296,160; which represents a 69.75 percent increase of \$778,834 over the current year Road and Bridge Budget of \$3,517,326. Gustad proposed a 3 percent wage increase for the 16 employees of the Highway Department. He also proposed: increasing equipment purchases from \$125,000 to \$425,000; increasing supplies spending from \$550,000 to \$1,065,000; increasing fuel expenditures from \$340,000 to \$400,200; increasing Secondary Road spending from \$350,000 to \$390,500; and decreasing the Annual Projects Fund from \$550,000 to \$250,000. Commissioners told Gustad his overall requests exceeded what could be approved.

Transportation Plan Study: The Board reviewed a proposed agreement with the State of South Dakota to fund a transportation planning study for the Yankton County area. Under terms of the proposed contract, Yankton County would be responsible for 20 percent of the study costs, but not more than \$20,000. Board members agreed to further discuss the proposal at its June 18 meeting.

Asphalt Zipper: Supt. Gustad presented a proposal for an Asphalt Zipper machine that can be attached to County loaders. The machine is used to grind asphalt into material that can be used as new road base. Total cost of the machine is \$179,970, and could be paid in five annual installments of \$38,506. The Board will discuss the machine proposal further at the June 18 meeting.

Highway Entrance Application: Supt. Gustad and the Board discussed a proposed application form for property owners who plan to build new entrances or approaches along any Yankton County highway. Gustad listed several specifications, including a minimum of an 18-inch steel culvert; 4-to-1 end slopes; clean fill dirt; and grass reseeding after construction. The application form requires exact location, a legal description, and date of installation. The proposed application fee is \$75.

Action 13262H: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Moore to approve and adopt the Highway Entrance Application presented by Supt. Gustad. All present voted aye; motion carried.

211 Program: EM Director Scherschligt and Helpline Center Director Janet Kittams-Lalley spoke to the Board about Yankton County participating in a 211 Helpline Program for Bon Homme, Hutchinson and Yankton counties. The program allows residents to dial 211 to get information on child care, volunteer needs, health care options, employment, severe weather, disaster response, suicide prevention and other services. Annual cost of the three-county program would be \$22,091 with Yankton County contributing \$13,462 of that amount. The cost share is based on 60 cents per resident of each county. The 211 service is currently available in the Sioux Falls metropolitan area, and a six-county region in the Black Hills. The 211 service is available statewide in the states surrounding South Dakota. Currently, 90 percent of people in the U.S. have access to the number.

Commissioner Freng spoke in favor of the program, saying people need to know where they can get information about various services available in the community. Commissioner Jensen said he liked the program, but could not vote to support it until later in the budget year. Commissioner Sinclair noted the proposed contract fo-

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cused on disaster response, and said language should be added about other services. Commissioner Moore questioned the cost of the proposal and said people may become confused whether to call 211, 511, 811 or 911 for various needs. No action was taken.

Yankton Search and Rescue: The Board discussed a proposed merger of the Yankton Search and Rescue Program with the Emergency Management Department. Under terms of the agreement, Search and Rescue equipment would be placed in Emergency Management's inventory and become county property. Scherschligt said the change would require no additional personnel, and he would still use Search and Rescue's current leadership chain of command for dive teams, search teams and rescue teams. Scherschligt said the merger would make both agencies stronger. He requested the change take effect July 1. Commissioners directed Scherschligt to bring a resolution to the Board's June 18 meeting for review and possible action.

Emergency Services Station #2 Project: EM Director Scherschligt presented a proposed Invitation for Bids for the Emergency Services Station #2 project - a vehicle storage building that would be located adjacent to the current Emergency Services Building.

Action 13263OEMHS: A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Freng to place the proposed Invitation for Bids for the Emergency Services Station #2 project on the agenda of the Board's June 18 meeting for review and possible action. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Commissioner Freng left the meeting at 4:20 p.m.

Claims: The Board reviewed a listing of claims from the past two weeks.

Action 13264C: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Johnson to postpone payment on an Arens Engineering claim until it can be acted on as a Ditch Board item at the Board's June 18 meeting. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Action 13265C: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Johnson to postpone payment on a claim from Utica Gravel and a claim from Tensator until the Emergency Management Director can be asked about them. All present voted aye; motion carried.

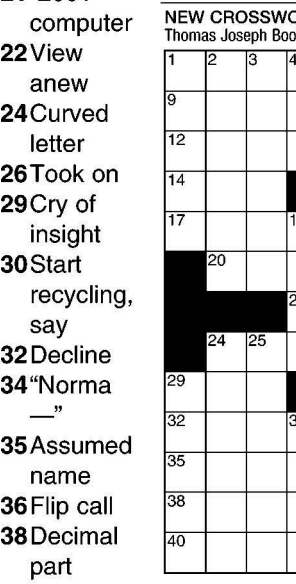

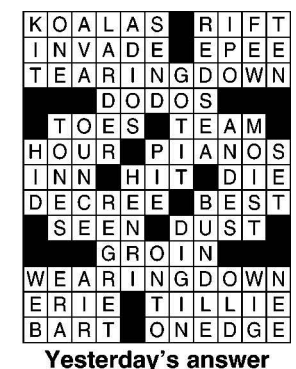

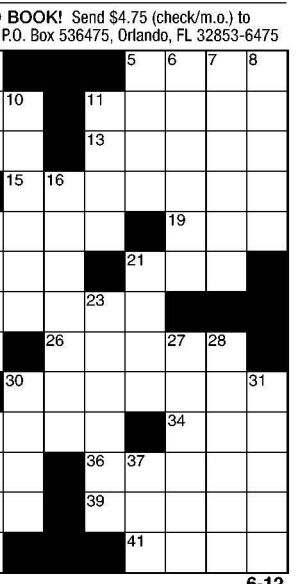
