The questions are not that difficult.....1. How do you put a giraffe into a refrigerator?-THINK BEFORE YOU ANSWER The correct answer is: Open the refrigerator, put in the giraffe and close the door. This question tests whether you tend to do simple things in an overly complicated way......2. How do you put an elephant into a refrigerator?-THINK BEFORE YOU ANSWER-Wrong Answer: Open the refrigerator, put in the elephant and close the refrigerator. Correct Answer: Open the refrigerator, take out the giraffe, put in the elephant and close the door. This tests your ability to think through the repercussions of your actions......3. The Lion King is hosting an animal conference; all the animals attend except one. Which animal does not attend? THINK BEFORE YOU AN-SWER — Correct Answer: The Elephant. The Elephant is in the refrigerator. This tests your memory. OK, even if you did not answer the first three questions, correctly, you still have one more chance to show your abilities......4. are attending the Ani-mal Meeting! This tests whether you learn quickly from your mistakes.....According to Andersen Consulting Worldwide, around 90% of the Professionals they tested got all questions wrong. But many preschoolers got several correct answers. Anderson Consulting says this conclusively disproves the theory

that most professionals have the brains of a four year old.

Before you get angry, stop and think a moment, most of the time we react and forget things that are important to us. But this is the summer a time for slowing down and thinking about what is taking place around us, a time to reflect on the values and priorities of life. Maybe it is time to think before you answer about a lot of things! I don't know about you but my tendency in life is to keep piling things on until there is little time left to focus on what is important and valuable to me. So I rush from one thing to another and the next thing I forget that I have to take the giraffe out of the refrigerator before putting the elephant in.

If you need an excuse for slowing down and relaxing, read what your medical doctor would tell you if you slowed down enough to visit them: Each year the American Institute for Preventive Medicine issues a "Top 10 Healthiest Resolutions." In the #5 position for 1994 was stress management. Stress is responsible for 2/3 of all office visits to doctors and plays a role in our two major killers heart disease and cancer. 62% of Americans say they experience a great deal of stress at least once a week. Those most likely to experience stress almost every day are people in their forties. To manage stress the institute recommends that people "practice a relaxation exercise, such as mental imagery, meditation, or yoga for at least 20 minutes every day." If in 1994 the stress was #5, can you imagine what it is today? I read recently that something like 60% of all doctor's office visits are related to stress.

What can you do, once again think before you answer? 20 minutes of meditation or guided imagery every day? Maybe that is what your pastor or priest has been trying to convey for years. Ironically, 20 minutes alone with God each day would fit neatly into a prescription for stress reduction. So next time you find yourself wondering if you can swim across that crocodile infested stream, or attempting to put the elephant next to the giraffe in the refrigerator, take a few minutes to slow down and talk to the creator of Heaven and Earth, I find that he does have a lot of good suggestions on what to do next. By the way it may not make you a better professional, but it will make you a better person and easier to live with. Enjoy your summer!

Venezuelan Leader Meets Pope To Soothe Relations

BOGOTA, Colombia -Venezuela and the Vatican haven't always seen eye-to-eye. During his 14 years in power, President Hugo Chavez often battled with the church, accusing leaders of participating in a coup against him and calling a Venezuelan cardinal a "troglodyte" on national television.

But on Monday, Chavez's successor, Nicolas Maduro, said he had an "extraordinary" meeting with Pope Francis at the Vatican, where the two men talked about poverty, politics and peace in South America.

Speaking at a news conference after the meeting, Maduro said he'd proposed that the Vatican and Venezuela work together to take the administration's signature social missions, which include free housing and health care, to other parts of the world.

"It was an extraordinary conversation with a human being full of humility," Maduro said. "I told him that I felt represented by the

ethics that he expressed." In a written statement, the

Vatican called the meeting "cordial" and said the men had discussed the country's social and political situation after Chavez's death, as well as poverty and the fight against crime and drug trafficking. Both parties agreed that there was a need for more contact between Venezuelan Catholic authorities and the government. But the Vatican didn't mention engaging in joint activities.

The meeting — the first for the two men — came as Maduro faces food shortages, runaway inflation and a belligerent opposition. Those problems followed him on his European trip.

The opposition coalition took out an ad in an Italian newspaper Monday thanking the pope for his interest in Venezuela and saying it was "fighting for a society" where we can all live and progress in peace, without exclusions, division or discrimination."

Maduro gave the pope a picture of Latin American Liberator Simon Bolivar, a copy of Venezuela's constitution, an

image of Venezuela's patron saint, the Virgin of Coromoto, and a statue of Jose Gregorio Hernandez — a revered Venezuelan doctor who died in 1919 and is expected to be made a Catholic saint.

In many ways, the meeting with the pope was another diplomatic victory for Maduro, who is fighting opposition allegations that he engaged in fraud to clinch the presidential race by 1.5 percentage points. This month, his government and the United States announced they would begin talks about exchanging ambassadors for the first time since 2010.

There weren't many reasons to have high hopes for Monday's meeting. In many ways, Maduro and Francis come from opposite political camps.

As the archbishop and cardinal in his native Buenos Aires, Francis often used the pulpit to take on President Cristina Fernandez and her late husband and predecessor Nestor Kirchner both Chavez allies and proponents of his socialist policies. A U.S. State Department cable from 2007 published by WikiLeaks referred to Francis, then known as Jorge Mario Bergoglio, as the "leader of the opposition."

While Chavez met with both of Francis' predecessors, he often accused the Venezuelan clergy of engaging in politics, supporting his rivals and undermining his socialist reforms. He also accused the church of being complicit in a 2002 coup that briefly ousted him. During a speech before the National Assembly in 2010, Chavez called the cardinal a "troglodyte" and warned him that Venezuela "can no longer be manipulated by the cassock.

Maduro seemed ripe to inherit the disdain for the church. As a youth, he was a member of the Communist Party and, more recently, has been a follower of Indian mystic Sai Baba. But since taking office, he's underscored his Christian beliefs.

"I am the son of Chavez," Maduro told state-run TV after meeting Church leaders in Caracas last week, "and if I learned something from him, it was to understand and deeply love Christ the redeemer. I truly carry him in my heart."
