I'll be honest: when I first saw the list of four finalists for the Dakota Wesleyan men's basketball job, I thought that either O'Gorman coach Derek Roby or Northern State assistant Matt Sevaraid would get the job. Both had impressive resumes, and both are Mitchell natives. Roby, while not experienced at the college level, had won five state titles with the Knights with a variety of styles of rosters. Sevaraid had college head coaching experience, at Presentation, and had stops including Gonzaga, Jamestown and Northern. Former DWU assistant Josh Mueller, the former Coyote standout, also had a solid resume. But Wilber came out on top.

Matt Wilber A Surprise, But Good, Choice For DWU

When I saw the tweet about the decision on Thursday morning, I was surprised. I knew Matt as an amateur baseball player, but not really as a coach. But then I looked at the 35-year-old Wilber's resume.

After time as an assistant coach at Augustana, South Dakota State and the University of Sioux Falls, he spent years as the director and co-owner of the Tibbetts Instructional Basketball School, which he ran with former USD standout and current Portland Trail Blazers assistant coach Nate Tibbetts before he was sold to Sanford Health. He helped grow TIBBS from a program that was first run in a home basketball court to one that worked with up to 1,000 basketball players a year.

That skill for player development — as well as the contacts built through years of player development — will serve him well as he looks to build on what has been a solid program at DWU.
