Consider this: Layne Somsen was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 22nd round of the MLB Draft on June 8. And Colton Iverson could very well hear his name called tonight (Thursday) during the NBA Draft.

Talk about an impressive month. Not only could Yankton boast two professional athletes by the end of the week, both would be from the same graduating class — 2008 — from Yankton High School.

Talk about rare. Sports editor James Cimburek and I could not find another city in South Dakota that could boast such a claim. Other towns have had players drafted in various sports (Mitchell's Mike Miller is the obvious

highlight), but we couldn't pinpoint one that had kids drafted by two different sports.

We'll have to wait and see what happens with Iverson tonight, but all indications — including those from his agent, Adam Pensack — would lead you to think the 7-foot center could get 'the call' tonight. Iverson himself would be the first to tell you that assuming certain things can lead to disappointment, but the work he has put in since the end of senior season at Colorado State this spring has vaulted him from an unlikely draft prospect to a likely draft pick.

For our town, that's something to be proud of. There are other months, I'm sure, that were quite notable — including Yankton football, basketball, volleyball, cross country and other titles — but nothing would come close to the national significance that having two athletes drafted by professional teams would hold.

Regardless of what happens tonight, Iverson's basketball career is far from over. He will find a place to play; whether it be somewhere across the country or somewhere overseas. Somsen, meanwhile, is out in Montana playing for the Reds' rookie ball team, and is already trying to rise the minor league ranks.

Talk about an impressive month.

## Doerr Repeats On Academic

### All-America Team

WAYNE, Neb. — Mickey Doerr of Wayne State College has been selected to the 2013 Capital One Academic All-America Division II Men's Track/Cross Country Team released this morning and selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Doerr received Second Team All-American honors, marking the second straight year that he has been named Academic All-American after earning Third Team recognition last season as a sophomore.

Doerr, a junior from Bloomfield, Neb. (Bloomfield HS), recorded a perfect 4.00 grade point average majoring in history and science education. A sprinter on the Wildcat men's track and field team, Doerr placed a season-best second in the 200 meter dash at the Mount Marty Twilight Meet with a time of 22.76 seconds. He also had season-best times of 11.41 seconds in the 100 meter dash (UNL Pre Drake Meet) and 51.55 seconds in the 400 meter dash at the Nebraska Invite. Doerr also ran a leg on the 4 x 400 meter relay team that finished seventh at the NSIC Outdoor Championships.

To be eligible for Academic All-America consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by

his/her sports information director.

Since the program's inception in 1952, CoSIDA has bestowed Academic All-America honors on more than 19,000 student-athletes in Divisions I, II, III and NAIA, covering all NCAA championship sports.

## Parkston's Bormann, Marion's Lickteig Qualify For Big 'I' Golf Nationals

SIoux FALLS — Sydney Bormann of Parkston and Arron Lickteig of Marion earned top honors and qualified for nationals at the Big "I" and College Preview golf tournament, held Tuesday and Wednesday in Sioux Falls. Rounds were held at Bakker Crossing and Prairie Green golf courses in Sioux Falls.

Dylan From of Hartford also qualified for the Big "I" national championships, to be held at the Country Club of North Carolina in Pinehurst, N.C.

Bormann shot scores of 71 on Tuesday and 77 on Wednesday to beat prep teammate Sydney Weber by four strokes in the girls' division. Kelsey Johnson of Sioux Falls finished third at 153.

Lickteig, a member of Yankton's Fox Run Golf Course, followed an opening round 67 with a 71 to shoot 138, five strokes ahead of From. Yankton's Jace Guthmiller tied for sixth at 145.

## NDSU Sees Huge Demand

### For Football Season Tickets

FARGO, N.D. (AP) — North Dakota State University has been forced to deny 1,300 season ticket requests for home football games next season, due to strong demand in the wake of the team's back-to-back national titles.

Season tickets in the 18,700-seat Fargodome are capped at 12,100 — about what was sold last year after the Bison won their first of two straight NCAA Football Championship Subdivision crowns.

The Forum newspaper reports that after all the renewals were completed this year, NDSU had 1,364 additional season ticket requests and could only accommodate about 65.

About 1,600 single-game tickets will be available for each of the six home games this fall.
