Lewin Just Misses NCAA Championships
FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — Teaviskie Lewin posted a personal-best time of 13.84 seconds in the 110-meter hurdles quarterfinals, but missed qualifying for the NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships by three-hundredths of a second as South Dakota track and field wrapped up competition at the NCAA West Preliminary Round at the University of Arkansas on Saturday.

Lewin finished seventh in his heat and 14th overall while topping his previous best time of 13.99 seconds. The top three finishers in each of the quarterfinals' three heats plus the next three best times qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Houston's Isaac Williams grabbed the final qualifying spot while finishing 12th overall with a time of 13.81.

South Dakota also had Dustin Valind compete in the men's discus on Saturday. He finished 45th with a mark of 164 feet, 7 inches.

South Dakota ended its season with no athletes qualifying for the NCAA Outdoor Championships starting on June 11 in Eugene, Ore. USD could have some athletes compete at the USA Outdoor Championships starting on June 26 in Sacramento, Calif.
