Notice is given that William Chenoweth, 30939 Niles School Rd, Springfield SD 57062 has filed an application for a water permit to appropriate 3.11 cubic feet of water per second from two wells to be completed into the Niobrara Aquifer (137 feet deep) located in the center of the NW 1/4 and the W 1/2 NE 1/4 Section 3 for irrigation of 233 acres located in the N 1/2 Section 3; all in T93N-R60W. Water Permit No. 7469-3 authorizes irrigation of the same acreage from a Codell Aquifer well as well as 16 additional acres.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends APPROVAL of Application No. 7985-3 because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on this application, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the application or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. NJ: Sports Bet Law Infringes On States' Rights

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. — New Jersey is bolstering its legal arguments as it tries to get the U.S. Supreme Court to consider its effort to overturn a ban on legalized sports betting in all but four states.

In a filing submitted Tuesday, the state says the federal law restricting sports betting to only four states needs to be reviewed immediately.

Theodore Olson, who won the Bush v. Gore election case in 2000, says the ban impermissibly restricts states' rights. He also says the high court needs to consider the way the law treats states differently.

The law restricts sports betting to states that met a 1991 deadline to pass laws approving it: Delaware, Montana, Nevada and Oregon.

The major professional and collegiate leagues support the ban.

plane landed in Pierre during a storm and decided to stay put rather than return to Sioux Falls. Showers and thunderstorms hit much of the state Tuesday.

Rounds, who served as governor from 2003 to 2011, far outpaced his opponents in fundraising, with a campaign account of about \$2.8 million. State Sen. Larry Rhoden had about \$136,000, state Rep. Stace Nelson about \$131,000, and attorney and Army Reservist Maj. Jason Ravnsborg less than \$11,000. Dr. Annette Bosworth raised more than \$1.1 million through March, but she has spent the majority of what she raised on direct mail marketing and her campaign fell deeper in debt.

GOP voter Bob Gilkerson, of Pierre, said he wanted to see a Republican bring some change to Washington, and he thinks Rounds is the one to do it.

"I'm mad at the way we're spending money," he said. "The debt load on our children is inexcusable."

Rounds will face Democratic business owner Rick Weiland and two independents on the Nov. 4 ballot. Running without party affiliation are former Republican U.S. Sen. Larry Pressler and former state lawmaker Gordon Howie.

Norma Shumaker, 74, expects Pressler to do relatively well in the general election because of dissatisfaction with the other candidates.

"I feel like there's a batch of people like myself that aren't party people but want the best for our state," she said.

Judith Edstrom, 66, said she believes Weiland, is a strong contender.

"We would have had a more lively (Democratic) race had one of the other candidates stepped into the race. But I'm quite happy supporting Rick Weiland," she said.

The race for South Dakota's lone seat in the U.S. House will wait for November. Both Republican U.S. Rep. Kristi Noem and Democratic challenger Corinna Robinson are unopposed within their parties.

In addition to the top two races, South Dakota voters cast ballots Tuesday in 22 state legislative races in which multiple candidates are bidding for party nominations — five Democratic races, and 17 Republican.
