REFLECTIONS

Every Spring we put out a table in the middle of our sanctuary and invite farmers, businessmen and families to bring items that represent their livelihood or that which is dear to them and place them on what we call "The Table of Blessing". For four or five Sundays right after Easter we pray over the table filled with business cards, corn, alfalfa, and soybean seeds in little baggies. We also have many family pictures and items that represent ministries and missions. The purpose is to draw attention to God's promises of seed time and harvest as promised in His Word. Psalm 67 declares that God wants to bless us with increase. We plant the seed of faith and He honors it by bringing increase in due season. We ask specifically because James reminds us that we have not because we don't ask or that we ask without specifics. A big example of this is when we pray for rain. A cloud comes over and we get a few drops. Why should we be disappointed when we are not specific? When your son or daughter come and ask you for money they seldom leave it up to chance as to what they need. They come with a specific amount they need in mind and ask without fear that you will honor it. Wise parents use the option of yes, no or not yet because they are interested in the

long view of their child's life.

Life is more than getting everything you want or even what you think you need. In God's thinking, everything of value to Him and us comes with a season. Not every season is the same length. The worst attitude our culture has today is one of immediate satisfaction. We get frustrated when the internet connection takes a few more seconds to respond to our commands. At the same time those same individuals will waste hours on line chatting or surfing or whatever else there is to do. Instant gratification is destroying many of our younger generation, because they want the instant relief, however fleeting it may be, to help them escape because the pressure of daily life demands too much.

Every time we open our mouth to speak we are planting a seed. Everyone has two invisible bags of seed. One bag is good seed that produces good fruit in its own season. The other bag is bad seed or weeds that take up precious ground space in our hearts and steal the life God intended to produce a good harvest. When you speak, you are

planting the seeds of blessing or the seeds of cursing. You can't make the seed grow, but you can choose which bag you are going to sow from. Wise counsel says, think before you speak. Christians have the benefit of the seeds of life that Jesus brings with Him when you invite Him into your life. You still have to choose which bag you are going to reach into when you react to life's challenges and disappointments. I know people who once were Christ followers that complained that God didn't answer their prayers so they quit following Him. Sow seeds of righteousness today for a harvest of right living tomorrow. Some people act like it makes no difference how they act or what they say and that life should be good for them. Paul said it best in Galatians 7:7-10...

7 Don't be misled-you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant. 8 Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death from that sinful nature. But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit. 9 So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up. 10 Therefore, whenever we have the opportunity, we should do good to everyone-especially to those in the family of faith.

Shroud Of Turin Exhibit Set For Menominee

OMAHA, Neb. — In celebration of its 15th anniversary, Spirit Catholic Radio is bringing a traveling exhibit, titled "The Man of the Shroud," to nine different cities across Nebraska, including Menominee, during June and July.

The free exhibit will be on display July 15-20 at St. Boniface Parish in Menominee. For times, visit spiritcatholicradio.com.

The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the

faithful and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth.

The exhibit will be on display at various parishes and Catholic high schools in cooperation with local Knights of Columbus councils.

The traveling exhibit, developed by the late Msgr. Giulio Ricci, president of the Roman Center for the Study of the Holy Shroud at the Vatican, includes as the centerpiece a full-length photographic image of the Shroud

made by the Eastman Kodak Co.

In addition, the exhibit contains a nearly life-size crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the Passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. It also contains 92 panels detailing the history and science of the Shroud.

"The Shroud was chosen to coincide with our 15th anniversary theme, 'Encounter Jesus,'" said Jim Carroll, ex-

ecutive director of Spirit Catholic Radio. "The Shroud brings the person of Jesus to something we can experience with our senses. My hope is that Jesus as a real person is something that can be carried with people after they view the exhibit. This is physical evidence that Jesus was a real person, and that he suffered and died, but of course, rose again."
