SDHP Investigating Clay County Accident

VERMILLION — Speed and alcohol are believed to be factors in a weekend crash in Clay County, according to the South Dakota Highway Patrol.

During their shift Friday night, Vermillion troopers responded to a single-vehicle rollover crash at the intersection of SD Highway 19 and the Volin Oil road.

A 2004 Oldsmobile Alero was westbound on the oil road when the driver failed to stop at the stop sign.

While the vehicle was traveling through the intersection, the driver lost control and went into the ditch.

Once in the ditch, the vehicle rolled several times, ejecting the unbuckled driver from the vehicle. The driver was transported to a local hospital with serious injuries.

The Highway Patrol didn't release the driver's name.

The Vermillion Fire and Rescue unit and the Clay County Ambulance assisted with response to the accident.

The Standard & Poor's 500 crept to another record high on Monday after U.S. companies announced a handful of deals. Hillshire Brands jumped 5 percent after Tyson Foods won a bidding war for the maker of Jimmy Dean sausages.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 18.82 points, or 0.1 percent, to 16,943.10.

The S&P 500 index gained 1.83, less than 0.1 percent, to close

at 1,951.27.

The Nasdaq composite index rose 14.84 points, or 0.3 percent, to 4,336.24.

Following last Friday's canvass, Desarae Gravatt of Lake Andes held a 324-323

margin over Gene Niehus of Wagner in the Democratic primary for Charles Mix County sheriff. Gravatt had held a two-vote lead on Election Night, but Niehus was later awarded one vote from a provisional ballot.

Niehus filed for a recount

Friday following the canvass, according to Charles Mix County Auditor Sherri Fuchs. The auditor said she was awaiting further information from a judge before proceeding

ing with the recount.

The Democratic primary winner will face Republican incumbent Randy Thaler of Lake Andes.
