

local Legion posts. Boys State activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, choruses and recreational programs. The program is operated by students elected to various

In addition to Dannenbring and Binder, area students elected as officers included Seth Weiland of Beresford (state treasurer), Dan Stibral of Tabor (Supreme Court justice) and Berk Ehrmantraut of Tyndall (speaker of the House).

Building at 2410 West City Limits Leading up to the final gubernatorial election, candidates were required to obtain time to reject any and all bids and petition signatures, campaign and make their way through primaries of the event's two fictional parties — Federalists and Nationalists.

"I put up posters and I talked to a lot of people to tell them I was running and why I'd be a good governor," Dannenbring said.

After winning their respective primaries, Federalists Dannenbring and Binder faced their Nationalist opponents, Aaron Krumholz of Mitchell and Brandon Vanosdel of Mission Hill, in a public debate in SOUTH DAKOTA HOUSING front of the other 312 Boys State participants.

The debate was strenuous, Dannenbring said, but the two Yankton students prepared thoroughly for the contest. He said it also helped to have one of his closest friends on his

"He knows how I think and I know how he thinks," Dannenbring said. "There were some questions that they asked that I knew Patrick would know how to answer them better, so I'd let Patrick talk. Or he knew I would know a question better, so I would talk.'

The election followed the debate, with both sides receiving an equal number of votes. The coin flip was used as a

tiebreaker. 'They said it's never hapoened in Boys State history,' Binder said. "It was pretty intense. Both parties were doing their own chant ... I was at the very back of the auditorium. John called 'tails,' and when they said it was 'tails,' I probably jumped 10 feet in the air. I sprinted up and said, 'We did it! We did it!' It was pretty

sweet. Both Yankton students said Boys State was an eye-opening experience, but for different

reasons. Binder said he hopes to pursue politics following high school, and the event helped him understand what

processes are involved. 'Even though it's a mock legislation, it was good experience for me," he said. "I got to see what goes on and how people actually make legislation and how hard it is."

Dannenbring, on the other hand, said the process showed him "how cutthroat the world of politics really is."

There's a lot of people that look out for themselves more than others, and it's hard to really know who is really for you or against you," he said. However, Boys State still in-

creased his interest in government, Dannenbring said, especially weighing sides of different issues. While he may not want to participate in an election, he still hopes to be involved in politics in some manner in the future.

"Even if you're not a senator, you can still have an influence in politics with what you believe in," he said.

As part of his duties as Boy State governor, Dannenbring will visit with South Dakota legislators in Pierre during the next session. He will also return to Boys State in 2015 to speak to next year's participants.

Both Dannenbring and Binder thanked the local Legion members for their sponsorship of the program.

"I would encourage other students to fill out applications to go to Boys State," Dannenbring said. "It was such a great experience."
