Beef was lower and pork higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle fell .73 cent to \$1.4572 a pound; August feeder cattle was .85 cent lower at \$2.0785 a pound; while July lean hogs rose .67 cent to \$1.2492 a pound.

Area Elections Decide School District Issue, Board Members

Voters in two area school districts went to the polls Tuesday.

In the Wagner school district, incumbent Scott Alderink was re-elected with 173 votes, followed by challengers George Langdeaux with 22 and Kelli Huapapi with 17.

The election drew 212 of 2,365 voters for 8.9 percent turnout, according to Wagner school business manager Lory DuFrain.

Meanwhile, Tripp-Delmont voters decided a ballot measure about the make-up of the board itself.

For the second time in four years, Tripp-Delmont voters rejected changing their school board from the current representation areas to at-large members. With an at-large board, members could be elected from anywhere in the district.

Tuesday's election resulted in a 67-65 defeat of the measure, according to Tripp-Delmont school business manager Sherry Hansen. The election saw about a 13 percent turnout.

The Tripp-Delmont school board put the measure on the ballot in response to increasing difficulty in getting anyone to run for office, Hansen said. In some cases, board members didn't file a petition for re-election but still were required to remain on the board.

The representation areas were set up as part of the Tripp-Delmont consolidation plan, Hansen said. A 2010 election seeking a change to at-large board members was defeated 225-220.
