CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery rose 5.25 cent to \$5.87 a bushel; July corn was 2.75 cents higher at 4.4150 a bushel; July oats were 4.5 cents higher at \$3.4275 a bushel; while July soybeans advanced 10.75 cents to \$14.09 a bushel.
Beef was lower and pork higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle fell .70 cent to \$1.4502 a pound; August feeder cattle was 3.00 cents lower at \$2.0485 a pound; while July lean hogs rose .50 cent to \$1.2542 a pound.
U.S. stocks closed higher Wednesday, getting a lift from the Federal Reserve's latest economic update. The Standard & Poor's 500 index to another record-high close as major stock indexes notched their fourth consecutive gain.
