The clerk of courts' office is located in the Bon Homme County Courthouse, 300 W. 18th Ave, Tyndall.

Originally, the clerk of courts in each county was elected by county voters. However, as a result of a constitutional amendment unifying the court system in 1975, the position of clerk of courts
