Highway Needs And Financing Interim Committee To Meet

PIERRE — The Interim Committee on Highway Needs and Financing of the South Dakota Legislature is holding public hearings in six communities across the state. One will be held at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St., Yankton, on Tuesday, July 1, running from 11 a.m.-1 p.m.

The hearings will focus on the current and future conditions and financial needs of state and local highways, roads, and bridges. This topic was selected as the number one priority by the members of the State Legislature for interim study.

The committee is seeking comments and input from the public on the highway, road and bridge needs and problems and possible solutions and alternatives to address the identified needs and problems. The committee will meet throughout the interim and then report their findings to the Executive Board in November.

Other meetings will be held in Sioux Falls, Watertown, Aberdeen, Belle Fourche and Rapid City.
