
## Swat Edge Lakers In Rain-Shortened Tereshinski Classic

# Former Coyote Wins Title

Scanlon Beats Out Current Coyote Clark For Amateur Title

VERMILLION — The 2014 South Dakota Open Pro-Am featured a former and current University of South Dakota Coyote golfers dueling it out in the final group on Sunday afternoon in Vermillion.

Kyle Scanlon, who hasn't played a competitive round at the Bluffs since his exit from USD, defeated Dakota Clark,

who will be a redshirt-junior next fall. Scanlon shot a -15 (201) to claim the crown. Nick Delio shot a final round 65 Sunday to win the pro title at 16-under 200, two strokes better than Kirby Pettitt and Jeff Burton.

I've mentally prepared myself for all kinds of weather. Luck-

ily, I had good tee-times, which helped me avoid the bad Scanlon actually feels more comfortable in the wind at

"I'm very used to the wind here," he said. "I like to lean the ball. I've played every shot here; from good to bad, I know what to do, which helped me in this situation.

After his second round, Scanlon knew he would have play solid and consistent golf to hoist the trophy on Sun-
