BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery advanced 18.75 cents to \$5.1250 a bushel; July corn was up 6.75 cents to 3.59 a bushel; July oats were 8.25 cents higher to 2.5275 a bushel; while July soybeans gained 14.75 cents to \$9.4075 bushel.

Beef was mixed and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle was up .15 cent to \$1.5330 a pound; August feeder cattle was .23 cent lower to \$2.2355 a pound; while June lean hogs fell .18 cent to \$.8447 a pound.

U.S. stocks edged lower Tuesday as a slump in utilities offset a gain in energy stocks. Utilities dropped as bond yields climbed following a report that showed global inflation was rising from a low level. Energy stocks gained as the price of oil rose with a weakening dollar.
