Sec. 17-42. Procedures.

(3) In instances where developments are proposed in B-Y Water Districts service area, the subdivider shall also consult with and obtain approval from B-Y Water Districts Manager or authorized representatives concerning the design of, and method by which water service shall be provided to the subdivision. The design and specification of the distribution ystem shall meet B-Y Water Districts and city specifications.

Chapter 17, Planning and Zoning Generally, Article III, Subdivisions, Section 17-59 Inspection, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 17-59. Inspection. Each facility installed shall be under inspection of the city engineer, and if the facility consists of water lines installed within B-Y Water Districts territory, the facility installed shall also be under inspection of B-Y Water Districts engi-

The Mother's Day twister, rated as an EF-2 tornado, covered 17 miles with a path 400 feet wide and winds peaking at 130 miles per hour. The storm hit Delmont particularly hard, destroying the town's west end including Zion Lutheran Church and the new fire hall yet to be dedicated.

The South Dakota delegation is seeking assistance as quickly as possible, Thune said. However, there is no firm timetable for Obama's decision or any guarantee that approval will even be granted, the senator added.

'There is a question of whether or not the (Obama) administration has concluded that (the dollar amount) reaches the threshold of damage (for a disaster declaration)," Thune said.

The congressional delegation is hoping for a favorable and timely response, Thune said.

Delmont, a Douglas County community of 234 residents, suffered significant damage in the tornado, the delegation noted. The twister injured nine persons and damaged 57 homes, of which 27 were completely destroyed.

"The local fire department was destroyed, and for two days the entire city was without power and water," the lawmakers wrote. "Fortyone percent of the City of Delmont's residential structures were damaged, the majority of which have major damage or are completely destroyed."

Following this incident, 89 percent of the population was voluntarily evacuated because of hazardous power lines, leaking propane tanks and other debris, the letter noted.

A number of residents are living in campers, renting temporary housing and staying in hotels, the lawmakers wrote. The nearest city capa-

ble of providing housing resources lies 40 miles away. Displaced residents are forced to move for long periods of time, greatly increasing their commute times for jobs and school.

"These factors may eventually force citizens to relocate if the situation cannot be remedied," the congres-

Local and state officials are doing their part but need federal assistance to meet the needs, the delegation wrote.

sional delegation wrote.

Both state and local governments opened their Emergency Operations Center (EOC) immediately following the tornado. In turn, Daugaard has directed the execution of a State Emergency Operation Plan. Affected counties have also issued disaster declarations.

In addition, the South Dakota Office of Emergency Management has coordinated resources to aid the local government response, the letter said. Daugaard outlined the details in his request for the disaster declaration and individual assistance.

The congressional delegation is requesting that Obama instruct federal agencies to quickly deliver federal disaster assistance for which the state qualified.

"We would be pleased to offer any assistance that you may require in fulfilling this request," they concluded.

are facing a great many difficulties," Xu told reporters.

Access to the site was blocked by police and paramilitary troops stationed along the Yangtze embankment. Scores of trucks belonging to the People's Armed Police were parked along the edge and at least two ambulances were seeing leaving the area with their

lights on and sirens blaring. Local Communist Party officials and the Foreign Ministry organized a boat trip for about four dozen journalists to a location about 100 to 200 meters (yards) from the overturned hull, where they were able to see some of the rescue work, including two men in orange life vests standing on

the overturned hull. The disaster has drawn considerable attention in Asia, and globally, and the tour was a way for normally reticent Chinese authorities to accommodate foreign media

requests for access. The rescue and salvage efforts are being run from a massive barge tethered a few kilometers (miles) upstream of the wreckage. Reached through a watery wasteland of flooded crops and trees torn in half by high winds, it was a bustle of activity, as rescuers, paramilitary troops and army and navy specialists arrived

and left by smaller boat. Huang Delong, a deckhand on a car ferry crossing the Yangtze nearby, said he was working Monday evening when the weather turned nasty ahead of the ship's capsizing about 9:30 p.m.

"From about 9 p.m. it began raining extremely hard, then the cyclone hit and the wind was really terrifying," Huang said while crossing the broad river in a steady drizzle Tuesday afternoon.

The survivors included the ship's captain and chief engineer, both of whom have been taken into police custody. Some relatives have questioned whether everything was done to ensure the safety

The Eastern Star was 251 feet (76.5 meters) long and 36 feet (11 meters) wide, and could carry a maximum of 534 people, CCTV reported. It is owned by the Chongqing Eastern Shipping Corp., which focuses on tourism routes in the popular Three Gorges river canyon region. The company could not be reached for comment.
