What Does Proverbs 10:14 Mean?

"If you have too many questions, you may not have any friends," says Myles, 6.

Yes, sometimes it's better not to know than to ask the wrong question. My friend Donna recalls the time she asked a college classmate, "Are you pregnant?" The pause after her classmate said "No" was indeed pregnant.

"If someone is talking while you are talking, you should tell them to be quiet," says Jonas, 6.

If you're a judge with a gavel in your hand, this might be appropriate. But it's doubtful that King Solomon had this in mind when he penned the proverb.

"When somebody knows something, if he is wise, he won't blabber it out," says Conor, 6. "A foolish man will blabber everything out, and everybody will know about it like a hidden key to a house."

To broadcast secrets, you can buy television time or tell a fool. Just because you know something doesn't mean you have to blabber it to anyone who will listen.

"This means a wise man acts wise and keeps hold of his wisdom until the proper time," says Tommy, age unknown.

Another proverb says, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver" (Proverbs 25:11).

Once stayed with friends in their Mississippi mansion, which reminded me of antebellum homes seen in "Gone With the Wind." Every room was perfect.

This is the sense of a word fitly spoken being as apples of gold in settings of silver. Our words should be appropriate and beautifully coordinated for the occasion.

"A foolish person can ruin something by telling all the private things, but a wise person would keep all the private things to himself," says Houston, 7.

Try asking yourself the following question when the topic of conversation turns to someone who is not present: Would you say the same thing if the absent person were present? This question would radically alter many conversations.

"Wise people think before they speak, and unwise people speak without thinking," says Karmen, 8.

The Book of James has often been thought of as Proverbs of the New Testament. It, too, contains many wise sayings about controlling the tongue such as, "Let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath" (James 1:19).

Application of this wisdom could transform our personal relationships and even world affairs. Increasing our eagerness to listen is the first step to lengthening the fuse on our anger. The mouth is not in gear when the ears are engaged.

"A foolish person is not supposed to tell someone all the secrets somebody told them," says Abby, 6. "A wise person keeps secrets and does good things that God asks them to do."

Change that to "any secrets" instead of not

telling all the secrets, and you've got a winner, Abby. One of the most famous defense attorneys in America is Herbert J. Miller, Jr. President Richard Nixon and Sen. Edward Kennedy are among his former clients. I once asked Miller, "What is the most important advice you give a client when he retains you?"

"Keep your mouth shut," he said. In addition to this succinct advice, Miller could have added Proverbs 6:2: "You are ensnared by the words of your mouth; you are taken by the words of your mouth."

Think about this: Sometimes silence really is golden. Other times, appropriate words are golden like apples of gold in a silver setting. If we were to choose our words as carefully as we coordinate the furniture in our homes, our inner environments would be transformed.

Memorize this truth: "Wise people store up knowledge, but the mouth of the foolish is near destruction" (Proverbs 10:14).

Ask this question: Is your ear quicker than your tongue?

Diocese Hosts First Rite Of Consecration Of Virgins Living

PITTSBURGH – Sheila Ryan said she sensed she has had an unusual call from God from the time of her upbringing in McKeesport, Pa.

It wasn't until recently, though, that she learned the Catholic Church had a name for it and an official liturgy to formalize it.

Early on a recent Sunday morning at St. Richard Church in suburban Richland Township, the retired school teacher and administrator became the first woman in the Diocese of Pittsburgh to receive the Rite of Consecration of a Virgin Living in the World.

With Bishop David Zubik presiding at the ceremony, she wore a white dress and received a ring and veil to symbolize her marriage to

Christ alone. She also received an edition of the Liturgy of the Hours, a set of daily prayers she has committed to offering.

"I knew as a teenager that I was not called to the married state," said Ryan, who is active at St. Richard. "It's listening to God and being open to his workings of grace within us. Nobody would seek this life, which is counter-cultural, unless it were a gift from God. And I consider it a gift."

While exact numbers are not available, best estimates are that there are about 230 consecrated virgins in the United States and about 3,500 worldwide, said Judith Stegman of Michigan, president of the U.S. Association of Consecrated Virgins.

"We have to provide as many opportunities as we can to help peo-

ple on their road to holiness," said Bishop Zubik. "There's not many people called to it," he added, but for those who are, "it's a legitimate option in the church."

Unlike a nun, a consecrated virgin doesn't join a religious community or make vows in the ritual, said Stegman.

While religious orders generally require a vow of celibacy beginning when someone joins, the rite of consecration is reserved for virgins, or those who have always refrained from voluntarily having sex with another. Those who have had sex but want to remain celibate in the future can make a private vow or join a religious order, Stegman said, "but it's different from this particular rite."

A consecrated virgin must provide her own home and livelihood.

She doesn't regularly wear the veil or any distinctive uniform, although she does wear the ring. She is expected to commit to prayer and to volunteer in her parish.

The rite traces its origins to Jesus' words in the gospel of Matthew that some people renounce marriage for the sake of the kingdom of God. The ancient church had a liturgy for women making such a commitment, but it fell into disuse in the Middle Ages when unmarried women committed to chastity were steered to religious orders.

Pope Paul VI re-instituted the rite on May 31, 1970, exactly 45 years to the date of Ryan's consecration, amid other reforms that sought to revive many ancient church practices.
