refusal to afford those people even basic grammatical dignity," wrote Dewey.

Timely disclosure: I resigned from the *Post* in 2010 after a controversy over crude personal opinions I expressed in emails to a listserv. At the time, journalist Amy Sullivan wrote that my resignation was "a good thing for journalism," because I'd said I didn't understand or respect why people would campaign against gay marriage. It was "a flat statement of uninterest in figuring out why some people believe gay marriage should be illegal," which meant that I could not cover those people. (I'd argue this was actually a lesson about why journalists should reach out to people instead of taking tweets out of context. I was talking specifically about people who devoted their careers to blocking gay marriage, not just opposed it. Even then, I was wrong to say I didn't respect or understand that.)

There has been no similar outcry about Dewey's ref-working for Jenner. There shouldn't be — AP rules are AP rules, and Caitlyn Jenner defines herself as a woman. Yet the bot said plenty about the assumptions of the pop culture mainstream, and how alienated conservatives felt from that. Seemingly out of nowhere, they were told that it was not just ignorant, but bigoted, to question whether gender identity was a construct instead of something assigned at birth.

Republicans who have walked into this

subject might as well have been walking over hot coals. After Jenner's "coming out" interview aired this spring, BuzzFeed's Rosie Gray asked former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum if the Olympian was a woman. "If he says he's a woman, then he's a woman," said Santorum. "My responsibility as a human being is to love and accept everybody. Not to criticize people for who they are. I can criticize, and I do, for what people do, for their behavior."

As Rucker and Costa report, Santorum had to massage that for social conservatives, but the answer even angered some trans rights supporters: Santorum was calling Jenner's transition a "behavior" and not a realization of identity. That same weekend, South Carolina Senator Lindsey Graham told Bloomberg that Jenner was a "tortured soul, and if he can find relief, and a better life, god bless." Still not quite the script, but both men fared better than former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee. Last Tuesday, BuzzFeed pointed to video of Huckabee joking that had trans rights existed when he was a boy, he "could have felt like a woman when it came time to take showers in PE." Comedy Central host Larry Wilmore suggested that Huckabee retile his latest book "God, Guns, Grits and Gravy and Go F— Yourself."

Republican candidates, unsure how to react, are otherwise remaining silent with one notable exception.

The only Republican diving into the issue by choice was George Pataki, the socially liberal former governor of New York, who tweeted a rebuke to Huckabee and a defense of Jenner: "If someone chooses a path that's different than mine, we should respect it as opposed to mocking."

able for anti-doping testing," said World Archery Event Director Chris Marsh. The USADA will be in charge of handling and testing the samples.

The center Marsh is referring to is located on archery lane, the vacant building which formerly housed a Mexican restaurant and now recent site of a "Welcome Archers" mural.

However, the results will not be available until after the WAYC tournament concludes, Dielen said.

Should an archer's drug test come back positive, there are several possible consequences upheld by World Archery.

First, after receiving a positive test, it is determined what substance was used. There are some positive cases in which the substance is not deemed illegal and archers will not receive any penalty, Dielen explained.

If the substance found is illegal, how the abuse is handled depends on which substance was taken.

"Specified substances could (require penalties) anywhere from a warning to two years (of

suspension)," Dielen said. "A heavy substance will automatically result in a four-year suspension."

The duration of suspension depends on regulations set by the anti-doping code, applicable to all sports world wide.

A World Archery panel determines the duration of a suspension on a case-by-case basis, Dielen said. The decision is compliant with regulations set by the WADA doping-code.

Dielen explained a recent doping case of an archer who purchased an online herbal supplement to lose weight. Despite being advertised as 100 percent natural with no side effects, the supplement contained illegal substances and for that she was suspended for eight months.

Should an archer earn a medal at the WAYC (or other World Archery competition) and later receive positive results from the issued drug test, it would be required of the archer to return the medal, and the medalists would then be altered accordingly.

There has only been one international doping case in World Archery, according to Dielen.

He said the drug testing is held more for educational purposes to prepare young athletes for what is expected of a professional athlete.

To educate archers, World Archery will hold two anti-doping educational seminars instructed by the USADA during the WAYC.

"We are holding seminars and have a desk so coaches and athletes are able to look at how the sampling is done," Marsh said. "They can find all the information about what an illegal substance is and what is not and the procedure for those who have never gone through it. When they're asked for a sample, they have an awareness for what they need to check for — what their rights are, the procedure and how it all works."

"We try to educate them because, ideally, we are the connector to champions here to the future Olympic world championships."
