

Community To Focus On Recovery For Delmont

DELMONT (AP) — An informational session and dinner is being held in Delmont for residents cleaning up from last month's tornado, as help continues to pour into the community.

The meeting on long-term disaster recovery is Thursday night at the Delmont Community Center, according to the South Dakota Department of Public Safety. The discussion will focus on resources available to residents, following the Federal Emergency Management Agency's denial last week of federal aid for people and businesses.

The May 10 tornado damaged or destroyed 84 structures in and around Delmont and injured nine people. The National Weather Service rated the twister as an EF-2, with a peak wind speed of 130 mph.

Volunteers are still needed to help with continuing cleanup efforts Friday and Saturday, the department said.

While federal individual assistance is not being made available to the town, it is getting help in other areas.

The fire department, which lost its fire hall with fire trucks

and an ambulance inside, has received trucks from the fire departments in Valley Springs and Fairview to use on a temporary basis. The Wagner Fire Department has volunteered the use of some of its equipment, and a farmer near Avon volunteered a tanker truck that he bought at an auction. Fire crews from Avon, Armour and Tripp took turns being on watch for about a week to allow the affected members of the Delmont Fire Department to tend to personal issues.

"It's been a huge lifesaver for our community," Fire Chief Elmer Goehring told *The Daily Republic* newspaper. "You couldn't deal with all that we've been going through for the last month otherwise."

Inwood, Iowa, provided an ambulance for Delmont. The town got a new ambulance in April and was considering what to do with the old one, said Marcia Rozeboom, who has been an EMT on the Inwood Ambulance Service for nearly three decades.

"We could see that they had a severe need, and basically asked if we could help them out," she said.

Delmont's fire hall was insured, and the fire department is hoping to have a new building constructed by the end of the year.

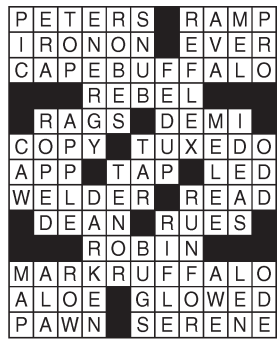

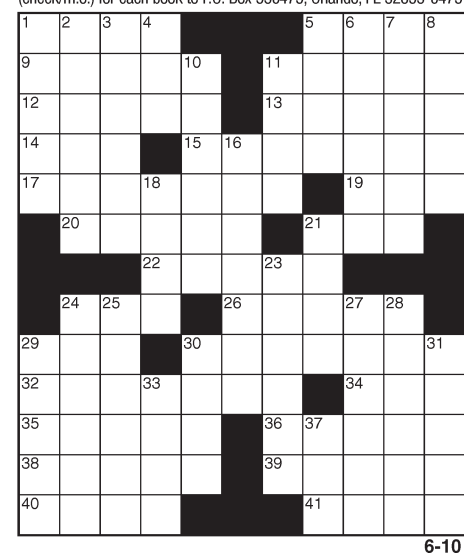

open to anything they might have seen."

Howe stressed that officials do not want the public to focus too heavily on the dark sedan.

"It is just one vehicle we are looking for," he said. "Honestly, we are looking for information that anybody would have if they had gone to the Highlines that day, at any time. We would like to

talk to them, because they may have seen something that they didn't realize was important."

He said they remain fairly certain that Hummel's death occurred at the boat dock area.

"That is where her car was," he said. "If her car had been parked one place and her body found another downstream, we would be more concerned. But we know she was fishing in that area where it happened."

Anyone who was in the area that day should call his office, Howe stressed.

He noted that toxicology and micro-

scopic results and the full autopsy may not be released for several weeks.

"Forensic examination of evidence is not going to happen within a half an hour like on television," he said. "Forensic examination of evidence can take weeks, so it could be weeks before we hear back from the lab. It is time consuming."

Saying until the results are received, a death certificate will not be released. Individuals with any information are asked to contact the Clay County Sheriff's Office at 605-677-7100.

"What did that customer do to make you mad?"

One time in those early years, an impatient customer mistook Metz for his twin brother, who had previously been assisting her, and slapped him when she thought he was being a smart-aleck for not knowing what she was talking about.
