USD Football To Host Weber State

In 2016 Home Opener

VERMILLION — South Dakota football will play its 2016 home opener against Weber State on Sept. 10 inside the DakotaDome as part of a home-and-home series announced Tuesday. It will be the first meeting between the two programs since 1970 and the first to be played in Vermillion.

The game will be played one week following South Dakota's season opener against California in Berkeley. The Coyotes renew their rivalry with North Dakota in Grand Forks the week after hosting Weber State which will conclude non-conference play in 2016.

The Weber State Wildcats, located in Ogden, Utah, are under the direction of head coach Jay Hill, a longtime assistant coach at the University of Utah. Weber State was 2-10 overall and 2-6 in the Big Sky in 2014 — the team's first season under Hill. The Wildcats made back-to-back trips to the FCS playoffs in 2008 and 2009, but have won two games in each of their last three seasons.

South Dakota and Weber State played to a 21-21 tie in Ogden on Nov. 21, 1970, in the only meeting between the two teams. South Dakota alum Steve Pelot ran for 134 yards and three touchdowns in a game that the Coyotes led 21-0 at halftime. South Dakota quarterback Tom Engleman passed for 100 yards and ran for 52 more in front of 3,700 in attendance.

The Coyotes are scheduled to host North Dakota on Sept. 16, 2017. South Dakota will return to Ogden to face Weber State on Sept. 15, 2018. Go to GoVotes.com for more information on future schedules.

Defending Champ Starts Strong

Two years ago at the WAYC in Wuxi, China, Domagoj Buden put together a memorable week and won the gold medal in the Compound Cadet men's division.

He's back, albeit in a new division, and off to a solid start in his quest for a repeat.

Buden, a 17-year-old archer from Croatia, sits in fourth place in the Junior division after his round of 697 on Tuesday — seven shots behind leader Stephan Hansen of Denmark.

"The whole competition is absolutely fabulous," Buden said. "It was one of the fastest qualifications I've ever been through. It was over pretty much before we started."

Buden has been to many archery tournaments, but never one in a town the size of Yankton, with under 15,000 residents.

"This one (tournament) is better organized, actually," he said. "China was a huge city, and I still like big cities. I wouldn't have minded if they had this in Central Park in New York (City)."

By virtue of his performance Tuesday, Buden has a bye into the Round of 16

threatening to a gold medal at international tournaments.

He's off to a good start in Yankton.

D'almeida leads the Recurve Cadet Men's division by one shot after Tuesday's qualification round, and like everyone else, had to battle the heat and wind.

"It was very nice shooting," he said through translation from a coach. "The wind was very strong, but I'm happy to be at a world championship."

D'almeida finished second at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games in Nanjing (China) and second at the Archery World Cup 2014 Stage 4 in Poland. He is now competing in his first WAYC.

"I'm looking forward to some high scores," D'almeida said. "I just want to do my best."
