Free CNA Training In Yankton Today

Interested in a healthcare career? In just a few weeks, you could be ready to provide care as a Certified Nursing Assistant thanks to the "Rural Rewards - A Call to Care" program servicing Yankton and a seven-county area.

Today (Thursday) from 1-3 p.m., Rural Rewards staff from Yankton Rural Area Health Education Center (AHEC) will be available for questions at the South Dakota Department of Labor office in Yankton located at 3113 Spruce, Suite 124. This is a great opportunity to learn more about the Rural Rewards program, the application process to be considered for free training, and what the training entails. Julie Schweigert, with Yankton Rural AHEC, will have applications and information available for men and women interested in a rewarding career as a CNA.

The demand for caregivers in South Dakota is expected to keep growing. "Rural Rewards - A Call to Care" project aims to help address those needs by increasing the labor pool for long-term care facilities in South Central South Dakota.

Selected applicants will participate in on-line education, on-site clinicals, skills review and certification testing. Rural Rewards is a project of the Yankton Rural AHEC and a consortium of 11 long-term care facilities.

The program is designed to provide flexible and accessible training. Participants can keep their present jobs during training. The Rural Rewards training program consists of 75 hours of various components of training, including on-line education, on-site clinicals, a skills review and certification exam.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed with big gains Wednesday, breaking a weeklong slump. Investors were optimistic that a break would come soon in the impasse between Greece and its creditors over extending the country's bailout loans.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 236.36 points, or 1.3 percent, to 18,000.40.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index gained 25.05 points, or 1.2 percent, to 2,105.20.

The Nasdaq composite climbed 62.82 points, or 1.3 percent, to 5,076.69.
