Meet and speak with others who are learning English. Classes are free of charge and registration is not required.

The Yankton Area Literacy Council and Southeast Job Link also provide ESL (English as a Second Language) classes to improve both reading and writing of the English language. Classes are scheduled as follows:

The work is led by Legislative Education chairpersons Sen. Deb Soholt and Rep. Jacqueline Sly.

The governor has identified three goals for this work: a quality system of schools focused on student achievement; a workforce of great teachers; and an efficient, equitable funding system that supports those goals.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery declined 9.25 cents to \$5.0425 a bushel; July corn was down .75 cent to 3.5650 a bushel; July oats were 4 cents higher at 2.5975 a bushel; while July soybeans were off 9.5 cents to \$9.40 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off .60 cent to \$1.5292 a pound; August feeder cattle lost .52 cent to \$2.2625 a pound; while August lean hogs were .73 cent lower at \$7.852 a pound.

U.S. stocks rose for a second day on Thursday after an encouraging report on retail sales suggested Americans are finally feeling confident enough to spend more. Seven of the 10 sectors of the Standard and Poor's 500 closed up, led by a 0.7 increase in utility stocks.

The Dow Jones industrial average increased 38.97 points, or 0.2 percent, to 18,039.37.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index climbed 3.66 points, or 0.2 percent, to 2,108.86.

The Nasdaq composite rose 5.82 points, or 0.1 percent, to 5,082.51.
