## Sanctioned Pedal Pull At Czech Days

TABOR — A sanctioned Pedal Pull will take place at Tabor's 67th annual Czech Days celebration. The pull will be for boys and girls ages 4-11. The pull will take place on Saturday afternoon, June 20, at 1:30 p.m. on the street south of Sokol Park.

Contestants will compete for a first place trophy or a second or third place ribbon in each age group. The two first place winners (one boy and one girl) in each age group (16 winners in all) will be eligible to move on to state competition at the South Dakota State Fair in Huron if they want to. ## BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery fell 15.25 cents to \$4.9525 a bushel; September corn was off 6 cents to 3.5275 a bushel; December oats were .75 cent lower to 2.6650 a bushel; while November soybeans were unchanged to \$9.0425 bushel.

Beef was higher and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was up .32 cent to \$1.5112 a pound; August feeder cattle rose .45 cent to \$2.2390 a pound; while August lean hogs were 1.25 cents lower at \$7.547 a pound.
