## Area Competitors Shine At Watertown

## High School Rodeo

WATERTOWN — Two area athletes won overall titles and five area athletes combined for six go-around wins at the Watertown East Region High School Rodeo, held Saturday and Sunday at Derby Downs in Watertown. Parker's Harlee Jo McKenney scored an average title in breakaway roping with a 7.400, helped by her go-around title with a 3.230 on Sunday. She also finished seventh in goat tying (19.740).

Avon's Rachel Blaha earned a title in reined cow horse (274.5). She also scored a fifth place finish in girls' cutting (68.0).

Elk Point's Payton Donnelly scored go-around titles in two events, breakaway roping (4.020) and pole bending (20.473), both Saturday. For the weekend, she placed fourth in breakaway roping (104.02), eighth in barrel racing (34.082), and ninth in both goat tying (21.820) and pole bending (47.11).
