Resurfacing Work On Hwy. 50 To Begin

VERMILLION — The South Dakota Department of Transportation says work will begin on an asphalt resurfacing project on Highway 50 between the Yankton/Clay County line to Vermillion this week.

Work on this project includes grinding and repairing the existing surface and shoulders, applying a new asphalt surface, repairing pipe culverts and erosion control work.

Traffic will be maintained through the project with a lane closure and flaggers. Motorists can expect delays and may want to consider an alternate route.

Work on this project is expected to be complete by Aug. 1. Duinink, Inc. from Prinsburg, Minnesota, is the prime contractor on the \$3.44 million project.

Young Eagles Events Set For Area

Young Eagles events will be held at Chan Gurney Airport in the terminal building on Saturday, June 20, from 8 a.m.-2 p.m., and at Vermillion Airport in the terminal building on Saturday, June 27, from 9 a.m.-noon.

The Yankton Chapter 1029 of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) is conducting the two events.

The Young Eagles Program of the EAA has the goal of giving 100,000 kids age 8 to 17 a free airplane ride in 2015.

The EAA achieved their previous goal of flying 1 million kids by Dec. 17, 2003, which was the 100th anniversary of powered flight first accomplished by the Wright Brothers. The current total is 1.9 million Young Eagles flown.

The YRAA has flown more than 2,700 kids in Young Eagle events at local airports including Yankton, Bloomfield, Gregory, Hartington, and Vermillion during the past 22 years.

A parent of guardian must sign a registration form that will be available at the registration table in the airport terminals. Young Eagles receive a flight certificate, pilot logbook for free web-based ground school training (ages 13-17 years old), and their name is placed in the world's largest logbook at [www.youngeagles.org](http://www.youngeagles.org).

Nelson told the *Press & Dakotan* that she was happy to see the award go to Viereck — and she isn't alone.

"I was overjoyed," she said. "Al is so deserving and I can't tell you the number of elected officials, colleagues, former elected officials who contributed to the nomination. Wagner School Voters Re-Elect Three

WAGNER — Three incumbents have won re-election to the Wagner school board. Richie Sully, Dennis Merkwan and Gene Niehus won three-year terms in Tuesday's election with a respective 194, 181 and 162 votes.

The fourth candidate, Galicia Drapeau, received 46 votes.

The election saw 201 voters cast ballots for 11.75 percent turnout, according to business manager Lory DuFrain.

The Wagner school district uses a cumulative voting system. Under the system, a voter can cast up to three votes in a race and can cast multiple votes for one candidate.

12.25 cents to \$9.3975 bushel.

Beef was lower and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off .57 cent to \$15.065 a pound; August feeder cattle fell .13 cent to \$2.2472 a pound; while August lean hogs were .82 cent higher at \$7.637 a pound.
